

# Idalia school campus a bit different as it makes way for new building

Idalia school campus is a bit different this year. The school building was demolished during the summer making way for a new school.

The school campus (modular and middle and high school building) is surrounded by a fence that separates the student areas from the construction zone and the construction areas are fenced off from the playground and gymnasium as well.

"We would appreciate your help in making certain everyone understands the importance of staying well away from the construction site," said Tim Krause, superintendent.

Feeding the students during this school year will require some changes when compared

to last year. Breakfast will be served to all elementary students in their classrooms. This is the same as last year for them.

The middle and high school students will pick up their breakfast in the lobby and take it to their first hour class to eat.

Without a resident kitchen, Mr. Krause said, our breakfast offerings, while nutritious, will be "grab and go" in nature.

Lunch will be served in the new restaurant. The children will be picked up from the school's entrance and bused to and from the restaurant each day. Meals will be similar to what was served last year.

Rosie Shanks and Joni Dutton have their work cut out for them, said Mr. Krause, but they said

they are up to the challenge. A minimum of two staff members will be supervising the students during lunch each day.

Bus drop off will be located at the north end of Richards Street which is the south side of the main school campus. Students will be held on the buses until 7:55 at which time they will be released directly into the fenced-in school site.

Students who are to be dropped off by their parents will also gain access to the school campus through the south gate.

If you should arrive while the buses are unloading, Mr. Krause said, please wait to drop off your child until the buses have cleared the area.

As space for students is

at a premium this year, the administration is asking that everyone refrain from dropping off students too early.

We have no space to hold them this year as there is no commons area available, Mr. Krause said. If you plan on dropping off or picking up a student during the school day, please check in at the office to let us know what's happening.

At the end of the school day, the process will be reversed by loading the students on the buses through the south gate. Parents who pick up their students after school will be asked to wait until the buses have loaded and left before they are allowed to leave.
