# Book Reviews

## Between The Lines By Jodi Picoult

Delilah hates school as much as she loves books. In fact, there's one book in particular she can't get enough of. If anyone knew how many times she read and re-read the sweet little fairy tale she found in the library, especially the popular kids, she'd be sent to social Siberia .. forever.  
To Delilah, though, this fairy tale is more than just words on the page. Sure, there's a handsome (well, okay, hot) prince, and a castle, and an evil villain, but it feels

as if there's something deeper going on. And one day, Delilah finds out there is.  
Turns out, this Prince Charming is real, and a certain 15-year-old loner has caught his eye. But they're from two different worlds, and how can it ever possibly work?  
Readers will be swept away by this story of a girl who crosses the border between reality and fantasy in a perilous search for her own happy ending.

## Rain Gods By James Lee Burke

When Hackberry Holland became sheriff of a tiny Texas town near the Mexican border, he's hoped to leave certain things behind: his checkered reputation, his haunted dreams, and his obsessive

memories of the good life with his late wife, Ric. But the discovery of the bodies of nine illegal aliens, machine-gunned to death and buried in a shallow grave behind a church, soon makes it clear that he won't escape so easily.

As Hack and Deputy Sheriff Pam Tibbs attempt to untangle the threads of this complex and grisly case, a damaged young Iraq veteran, Pete Flores, and his girlfriend, Vikki Gaddis, are running for their lives, hoping to outwit the bloodthirsty criminal who wants to kill Pete for his involvement in the murders. The only trouble is, Pete doesn't know who he's running from: drunk and terrified, he fled the scene of the crime when the shooting began. And, there is a long list of people who want Pete and Vikki dead: crime boss Hugo Cistranos, who hired Pete for the operation; Nick Dolan, a strip club owner and small-time gangster with revenge on his mind; and a mysterious God-fearing serial-killer-for-hire known as Preacher Jack Collins, with enigmatic motives of his own.

With the FBI, Immigration and Customs Enforcement, and a host of cold-blooded killers on Pete and Vikki's trail, it's up to Sheriff Holland to find them first and figure out who's behind the mass murder before anyone else ends up dead.
