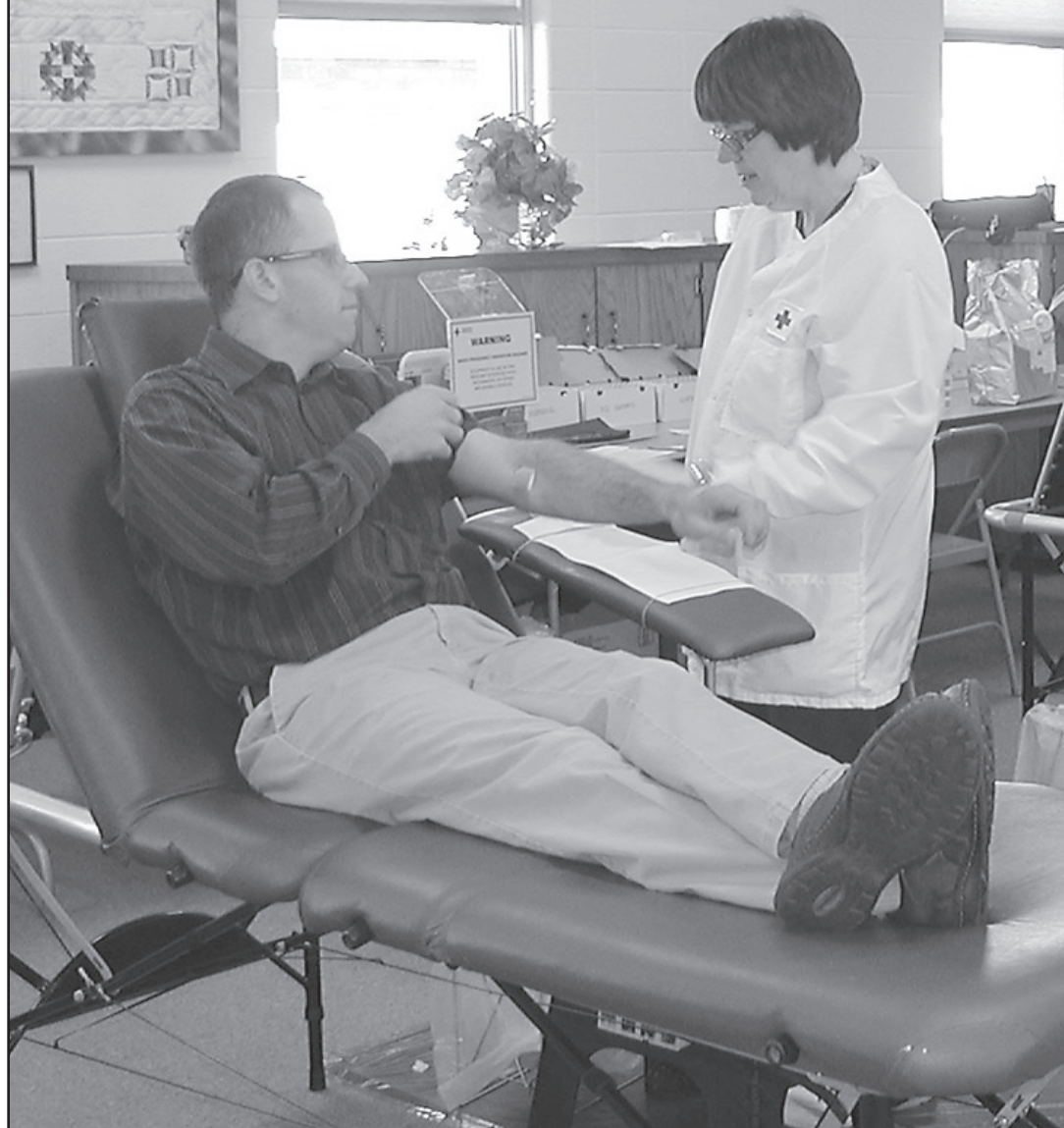
Mr. Knox says he is looking forward to becoming a part of the Bird City and St. Francis communities.

## Health fair coming Nov. 12

The Cheyenne County Hospital, Clinic and Health Departments will be sponsoring the Cheyenne County Fall Health Fair Nov. 12, 13 and 14, for blood draws in St. Francis and Nov. 15 and 16 for blood draws in Bird City. No appointments are needed.

Those having blood draws in St. Francis need to go to the clinic basement between 6:30 and 10 a.m. on the specified days.

In Bird City, people should go to the Bird City Clinic between 6:30 and 10 a.m. on the specified days.

Remember to fast for the chem panel lab test (nothing to eat or drink except water and prescription medication after midnight (Note - People can take their medication the morning

of their blood lab draw. Drink plenty of water.)

The women and men exams will be offered Nov. 19, 20 and 21 in both St. Francis and Bird City. This is a format change from the previous health fairs held in Cheyenne County for both blood draws and exams.

A female exam includes a breast and pelvic exam with Pap smear. The male exam will include a prostate check.

Call the Cheyenne County Clinic for an appointment at 785-332-2682 or 785-734-2200.

The lab work available includes: a chemistry panel (with TSH and Lipid panel) Hemoglobin A1C and PSA.

The fee is due at time of service and will not be billed to insurance. The fee is also at a

much reduced price for this health fair. Lab results will be made available at the exam scheduled appointment. Those who do not have a scheduled appointment will have the results mailed to them with a message regarding their labs after reviewed by the medical providers. They may recommend that an appointment to be seen by a provider be made.

Blood pressure, height and weights and body mass index scoring will also be available during the St. Francis blood draw dates.
