#### ORDER OF CLOSING BOOKS and NOTICE OF PLACES AND DATES OF REGISTRATION BEFORE SPECIAL ELECTION December 11, 2012

Pursuant to K.S.A.25-2311(c), notice is hereby given that on the 20th day of November, all registration books for the special election will close at the end of regular business hours. Registration books will remain closed until the 12th day of December, 2012.

In compliance with the provision of K.S.A. 25-2310, notice is hereby given that the books for registration of voters will be open during regular business hours at the offices of the County Clerk and the City Clerk in St. Francis and at the First National Bank in Bird City.

A citizen of the United States who is eighteen (18) years of age and upwards or will have attained the age of eighteen (18) years at the next election may register to vote. When a voter has been registered according to law, his or her registration shall continue to be valid until the voter changes their name by marriage, divorce or legal proceedings or changes their residence. Any person may apply to be registered in person or by mail to the Election Officer. Application forms shall be provided by the County Election Officer upon request in person or in writing by an individual applicant. Such applications shall be signed by the applicant under penalty of perjury.

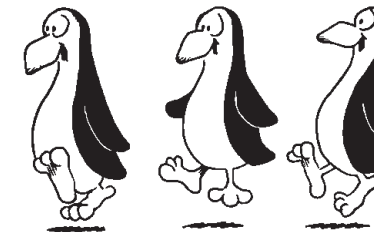

Notice is hereby given that there will be a special question election in Cheyenne County on the 11th day of December 11, 2012 for the purpose of voting on the following question:

SHALL THE METHOD OF ELECTION AND THE VOTING PLAN FOR USD 103 BE CHANGED?

Shall the voting plan and method of election of the Board of Education of Unified School District No.103, Cheylin, Cheyenne County, be changed, pursuant to K.S.A. 72-8001 et seq., from the present two (2) member district, one (1) at-large, method of election and voting plan B, in which all electors, who are otherwise qualified according to law and who reside in the member district may vote in the primary election for the member positions of such member districts and for the at-large member position, and all electors, who are otherwise qualified according to law, and who reside in the school district may vote in the general election for all member positions, including the at-large member position, to be filled, to the At Large Method under which the school district is not divided into any member districts, and all board members are elected at large, and to voting plan A under which all electors, who are otherwise qualified according to law, and who reside in the school district may vote in both the primary and general election for all member positions.

"Shall a change in the method of election and voting plan, as described in the ballot title above, be approved?"

The said special question election shall be held, conducted and governed in all respects as provided by law. The vote shall be by ballot upon which the foregoing question and voting instructions shall be printed.

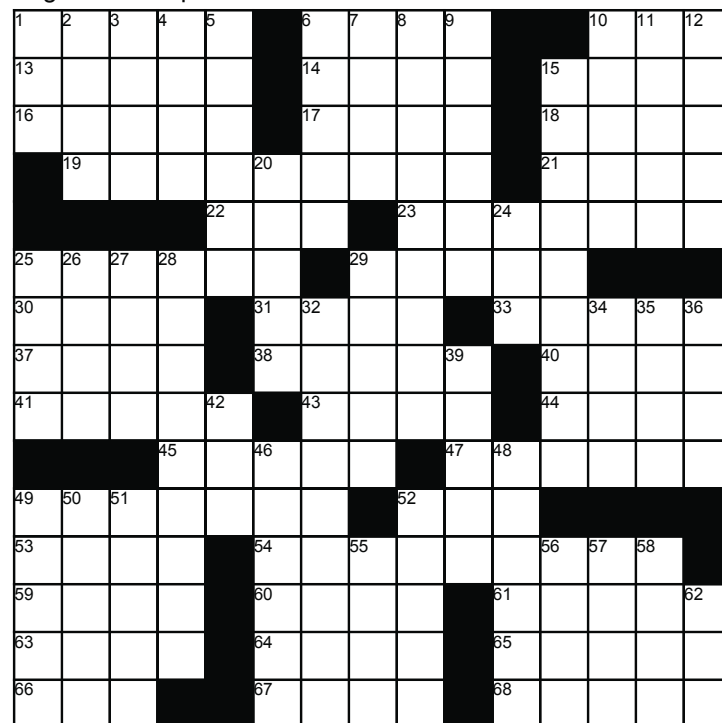
