President Lampe introduced the newest member, Jerry White. A new member ceremony was held to welcome Jerry to the St. Francis Lions Club.

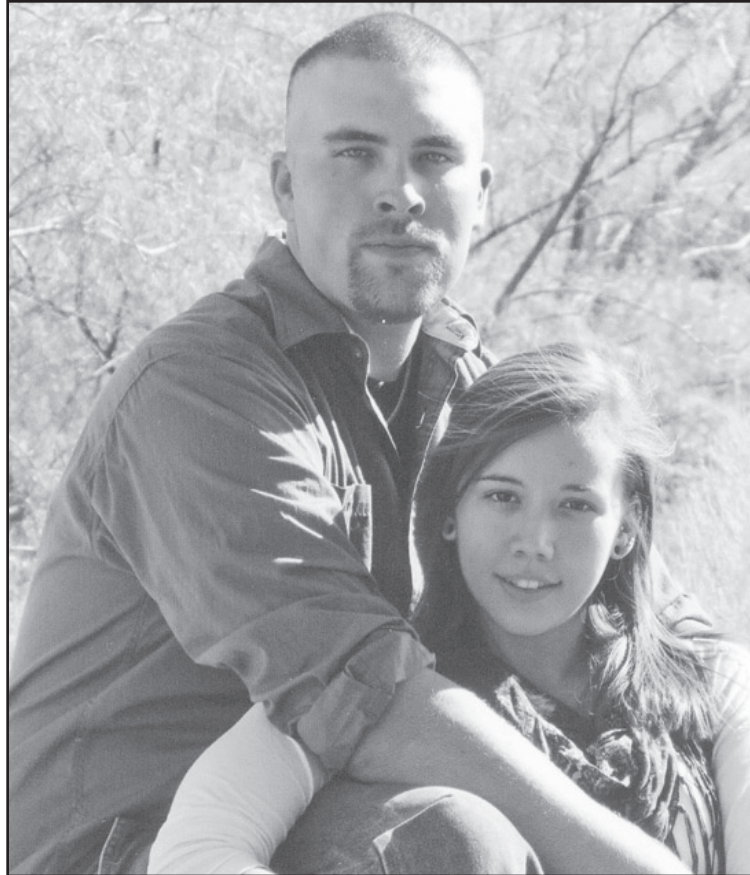
The minutes from the Oct. 8 meeting were read and approved.

The money coversenrolling costs for the Little, recruitment costs for the Big; screening and background checks for the potential Big to ensure safety of the Little; and ongoing support by case managers to provide education and match monitoring.

Kids who participate in the Big Brothers Big Sisters program are 70-percent less likely to be arrested; 55-less likely to skip school; 46-percent less likely to initiate drug use; 33-percent less likely to engage in violent confrontations; and 27-percent less likely to start drinking alcohol.
