Lady Indians struggle to pace the Lady Bulldogs

After the lead extended to 4-10, Justice Wiley drained a trey with 18 seconds left in the first period to trim the lead to three. Quinter answered with a basket at the buzzer. The Lady Indians trailed 7-12 after one quarter of play.

By 6:14, the Lady Indians trailed 10-20 due to several turnovers and rebounding that allowed second chance baskets to the Lady Bulldogs.
