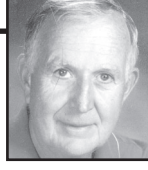

The Senate plan, however, would leave the sales tax at the current 6.3 percent instead of allowing it to drop by the scheduled 0.6 percent. By leaving the sales tax as is, the Senate plan would use the additional revenue from the sales tax to continue to buy down income tax rates.

Daughter graduates from university

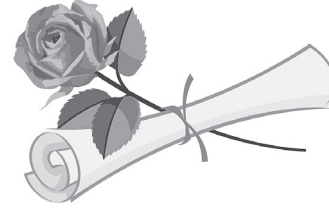
