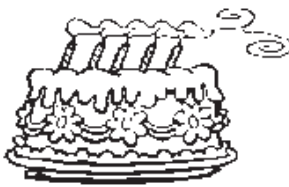

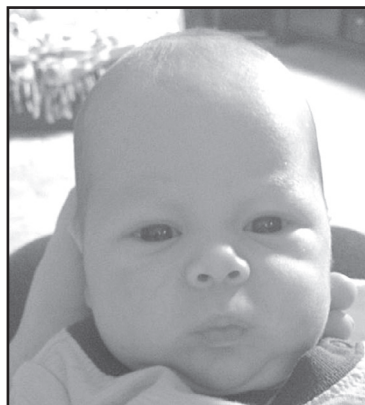


Introducing
