During his full-evening stage show, Mr. Karges says he will risk his performance fee as a demonstration of his unique abilities.

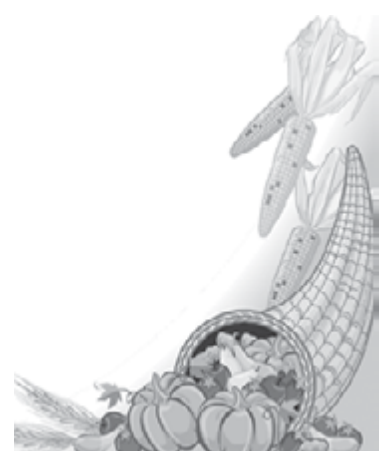

"If I am successful in controlling my volunteer's thoughts, the envelope remaining should contain my check. If not, Western Plains Arts Association won't have to worry about me cashing my check!"

Mr. Karges was named by "Performance" magazine as one of the top five touring variety/family shows of the year, alongside David Copperfield, Disney on Ice, the Campbell Soup World Figure Skating Tour, and Barney the Dinosaur.

In Mr. Karges' particular show, tables float, minds are read, metal bends, and your imagination will be challenged because you won't

believe your eyes! According to Karges, he does not possess supernatural powers, nor does he claim to perform as a psychic or magician. He also offers \$100,000 to charity if anyone can prove he uses stooges or confederates from the audience to aid him in his demonstrations.
