The St. Francis junior high Indians A and B teams remained undefeated this season by beating the Sharon Springs Wildcats on Monday, in St. Francis. Both the A and B teams continued to look impressive, playing a strong offensive and smothering defensive game.

The Lady Indians A team totally dominated the Wildcats, crushing Sharon Springs 42-9. The Lady Indians confounded Sharon Springs with a full court press, causing many first half turnovers. St. Francis was able to convert many easy baskets, and jumped out quickly, leading 15-0 at the end of the first quarter.

In the second quarter, the Lady

Indians, using many second string players, continued to pull away and led 21-2 at half time.

St. Francis continued to run away from the Wildcats and led 30-4 at the end of the third quarter.

With the 30 point running clock rule evoked through most of the fourth quarter, the rout continued and the Lady Indians finished off Sharon Springs 42-9.

Indians sweep Oberlin in junior high basketball play

The St. Francis junior high Indians opened the basketball season by sweeping the Oberlin Red Devils on Thursday, Oct. 7 in St. Francis. Both the A and B teams played a very strong offensive and defensive game in overpowering the Red Devils.

The Indians A team played a close first half and trailed 12-10 at the end of the first quarter and were behind 16-14 at halftime.

The Indians defense rose up in the third quarter and held Oberlin to just one field goal, pulling ahead 24-18 at the end of three quarters.

St. Francis held a comfortable ten point lead very late into the fourth quarter 36-26. As the time wound down, the Red Devils connected on two long desperation 3 pointers to cut into the Indians lead. Oberlin could do no more and, as the horn sounded, the Indians took the victory 36-32.

“We are attempting an up-tempo game this year, and we are still out of shape for that style of play,” said coach Rob Schiltz. “Our shooting percentage as a team was not very good, but our hustle was excellent.”

The Indians scoring was led by Tate Busse, 13 points; Dalton Straub, 10 points; Trayton

Doyle, 8 points; Luke Lampe, 6 points; Jordan Raby, 2 points.

The Lady Indians A team had no trouble with their counterparts from Oberlin. Led by Zoe Sundstrom and Hanna Bracelin, each scoring six points in the first quarter, the Lady Indians jump out to a 10 point lead 14-4 at the end of the first quarter.

The domination continued into the second quarter, as the Lady Indians broke open the game and opened up an 18 point lead going into half time, 26-8. St. Francis continued to pour it on in the third quarter and led 37-12 after three quarters.

Lauren Johnson and Joslyn Ketzner scored 4 points each in the fourth quarter to help the Lady Indians bounce the Red Devils, 47-16.

The Lady Indians scoring was led by Hanna Bracelin, 12 points; Zoe Sundstrom, 11 points; Lauren Johnson, 8 points; Madi Tice, Emileigh Dinkel, Joselyn Kitzner each had 4 points. Lindsay Johnson rounded out the scoring with 2 points.
