Among the new members was Stephanie Perry, St. Francis. Membership is based on grade point averages and other criteria, with members focusing on scholastic achievement and service to community and campus.

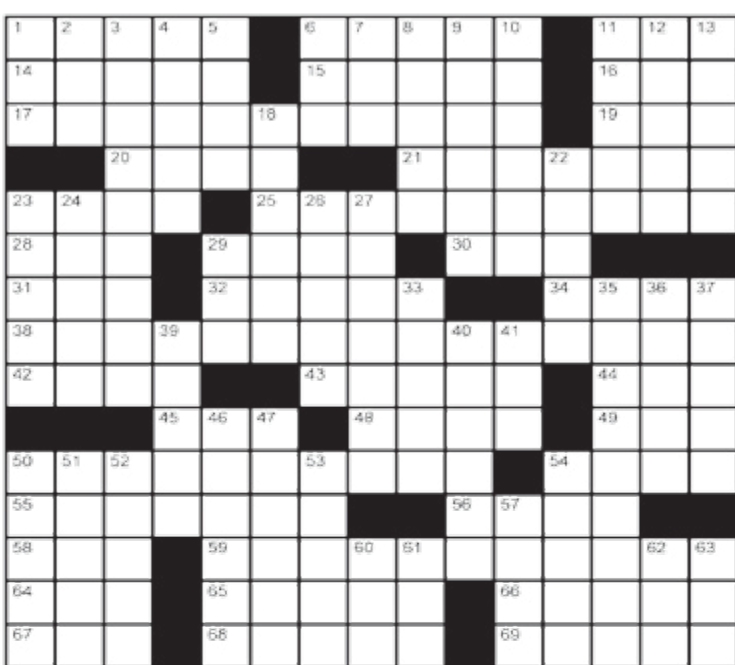
