

# Indians win at Tribune

### Lady Indians

The boys are really aggressive on our press and they read the floor well, which enables them to steal the ball quite often," said Coach Rob Schiltz. This helped establish a first quarter lead of 19-6 and the Indians were up by 23 points, 31-8 at the half.

"Our big guys underneath started the break with outstanding outlet passes and our guards usually finished the break with and uncontested layup," said Schiltz. The Indians continued to dominate and at the end of the third quarter led by 36 points, 48-12.

"The guys off the bench contributed much to the games as well," said Coach Schiltz. They were able to see a lot of quality playing time. They did some good things including contributing 12 points to the score collectively and playing some good defense." The fourth quarter was more of the same from the Indians and they finished off the Jackrabbits 55-18.

# Indians split with Atwood

The St. Francis junior high teams took on the Atwood Buffaloes in St. Francis on Nov. 21. The A team Lady Indians won a close battle, while the Indians A team played a close first half, before pulling away in the second half to defeat the Buffaloes. The B team Lady Indians played a hard contest before falling behind as the clock ran down and lost their contest. The B team Indians also had a close game, losing in the final seconds.

### Lady Indians

The Lady Indians A team playing a tough Atwood squad trailed the Buffaloes through most of the game. At the end of a low scoring first quarter St. Francis was behind 6-1. The Lady Indians played the Buffaloes evenly through the second quarter and were down by 4, 13-9 at the half.

The third quarter again was an even contest, with Atwood still maintaining a 4 point lead, 16-12. In the fourth quarter the Indians got their game back on track outscoring the Buffaloes, 9-3 to take the game 21-19. No statistics were made available for this game.

In B team action, the St. Francis Lady Indians appeared evenly matched against Atwood. The game was close throughout, until the Buffaloes made several key baskets as the clock ran down and knocked off St. Francis, 34-27.

### Indians

The Indians started off slowly against the Buffaloes in the first half, as Atwood, matched the Indians basket for basket.

"Atwood was the best team we have played so far," said Coach Rob Schiltz. "They played the best man-to-man defense we have seen so far and out guys did alright against it. St. Francis lead 10-9 at the end of the first quarter and 23-21 and the half."

"During the first half we did not rebound cleanly and therefore our fast break suffered. Our press was not quite as effective in this game either. That is to be expected against a talented opponent," said Schiltz.

The Indians broke open the game in the third quarter, taking a commanding 43-23 lead. The bench came in and played most of the fourth quarter preserving a 47-37 victory for the Indians.

"In the second half, we changed defenses to just half-court and really focused on

rebounding and running the ball. It proved to be a good choice since we outscored Atwood 20-2 in the third quarter. The big guys underneath did a great job rebounding in the third quarter and the guys out front finished well. We seem to play best when the fast break is working," said Coach Schiltz.

Leading scorers for the Indians: Trayton Doyle, 15 points; Tate Busse, 10 points; Luke Lampe, 9 points; Dalton Straub, 6 points; Nick Paulsen, 4 points; Martin Beikman, 3 points.

In B team action the Indians dropped a heartbreaker, in the final seconds. With the score tied at 38 with 5 seconds left, an Atwood shooter was fouled and the basket counted. He made the free throw and the Buffaloes upset the Indians 41-38.

The next game for the Indians will be Monday, Nov. 25 against the Oberlin Red Devils in Oberlin, beginning at 4:30 p.m.
