# Local equestrienne earns show honors

The Colby Community College Equestrian Team competed in the first competition of the spring semester hosted by the Nebraska College of Technical Agriculture (NCTA) in Curtis, Neb., on Feb. 1-2. Cateline Isley of St. Francis finished in second place in the Advanced Horsemanship, Show 1 and fourth in Advanced Horsemanship, Show 2.

"Our team rode great," said Head Coach Shanda Mattix. "Their hard work and positive attitudes are paying off. We were awarded High Point Team at both shows."

The recognition is based on the points accumulated by individual riders on each team. In addition to Colby Community College, other schools competing were Nebraska College of Technical Agriculture, University of Colorado-Boulder, Laramie County Community College, Oklahoma Panhandle State University, United States Air Force Academy, University of Nebraska-Lincoln and the University of Wyoming.
