## Indians suffer loss against tough Hoxie teams

The St. Francis Lady Indians and Indians varsity went up against the number one Hoxie Indians Friday, Feb. 7 in St. Francis. While the Lady Indians and Indians played hard, and gave it their best, the teams were no match for a more disciplined and quicker Hoxie teams. The Lady Indians were soundly beaten 76-17, and the Indians did not do much better and were defeated 76-25.

### Lady Indians

The Lady Indians went up against a much taller and faster Hoxie team. St. Francis started off in the first quarter, making too many mistakes and missed passes. Hoxie converted the mistakes, and had many easy layup baskets. Hoxie stormed ahead and was leading 33-5 at the end of the quarter.

St. Francis continued making mistakes in the second quarter. While the Indians continued to play hard, the Hoxie

defense forced many easy baskets. St. Francis had many fast break opportunities that fell apart, when the Indians could not convert the basket. St. Francis was able to only score 2 points in the second quarter, and Hoxie continued to dominate, 49-7 at the half.

In the third quarter, Hoxie began to knock down 3 pointers at the beginning of the quarter, and were pouring it on. As the quarter progressed, the air was pretty much out of the Indians game. Hoxie was up 71-11.

A continuous clock was running during the fourth quarter, as Hoxie used more of their bench. The Indians were unable to get anything going at all. Final score 76-17.

### Indians

Hoxie came out swinging in the first quarter and quickly built up a 7-0 lead in the first few minutes. St. Francis was having a difficult time breaking the Hoxie full court press, and turned the ball over several times. The Indians had a cold shooting quarter, and missed several layup attempts. The ball just bounced off the rim and out. Hoxie jumped out to a 27-7 lead at the end of the quarter.

In the second quarter, St. Francis continued to have problems with the Hoxie press, and could not make much headway against it. The Indians didn't seem to have an answer for anything Hoxie did. St. Francis did not score

a point in the second quarter, and Hoxie was up 42-7 at the half.

St. Francis continued to play hard in the third quarter, and was able to get more points on the board. The Hoxie fast break continued to pile up the points. Hoxie was up 65-23 at the end of the quarter.

With a continuous clock running in the fourth quarter, both teams emptied their benches. The Indians continued to play hard, but nothing that St. Francis tried would work very well, and Hoxie prevailed 76-25.

Indians scoring: Cade Braccin, 11 points; Taylor Rogers, 5 points; Wyatt Landenberger, 5 points; Mason Schiltz, 3 points; Jacob Baxter, 1 point.

"We got steamrolled by a very good Hoxie team Friday night. The guys knew going in that we would have to play our best game of the year just to stay with one of the top 3 teams in our division, with the hopes of maybe stealing the game late. That obviously didn't happen," said Coach Jeff Beims.

"We couldn't buy a shot early on, and then as we began to press the issue, it just got worse. They on the other hand, couldn't miss a shot. When they did, they seemed to get every rebound. Obviously this wasn't our best performance of the year, but we can't let it define who we have worked hard to become. We will do better this week."
