Crews plow 565,000 miles last week

Kansas Department Transportation snow crews plowed and treated 565,000 lane miles of highway during last week's snow storm at a cost of nearly \$3 million.

Department drivers operated 591 trucks around the clock in 12-hours shifts to treat and clear roads of snow and ice in every region of the state. About 1,100 snow plow operators logged more than 37,000 hours from Feb. 3-6.

"The snow amounts, wind, and frigid temperatures, made this a dangerous storm for our crews. I can't thank them enough for their hard work and dedication in keeping the roads safe for travel," said Mike King, transportation secretary.
