Lady Indians season ends

 The St Francis Lady Indians went up against the number one seeded Hoxie Lady Indians in the Sub-State Tournament, played Friday night in Quinter. The Lady Indians were beaten 72-26, and their season came to an end. St. Francis finished the season with a 5-18 record.

 The Lady Indians went up against a swarming full court pressure defense from Hoxie in the first quarter. Hoxie was converting many shots, and left the Lady Indians far behind from the start. St. Francis trailed 23-5 at the end of the quarter. Hoxie continued to pour it on in the second quarter, as both teams doubled their scoring of the first quarter. This still did not help St. Francis, who now trailed 46-10 at half time.

Hoxie came out in the third quarter, duplicating everything that they had done in the first half. St. Francis was only able to muster a meager offense, scoring 5 points in the quarter. Hoxie led 59-15.

A continuous clock was running in the fourth quarter as the 30 point rule was imposed. Hoxie's bench was playing most of the quarter, and closed out the 72-26 victory.

"This team was a fun team to work with. Unfortunately, we had 3 girls get injured, which took our decent sized team down to a small team. We worked hard throughout the season, making adjustments as we went along, and did the best that we could. I am excited to see where this team is headed. Without any seniors this year, this team could (and hopefully will) be back, stronger than ever next year. Fortunately, this is the time of year where our improvement really begins," said Coach Dinkel.

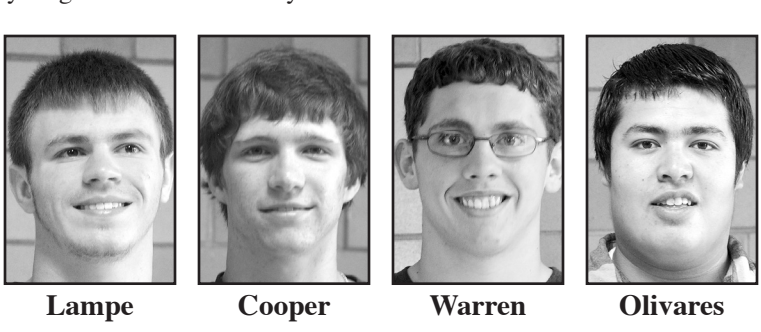
