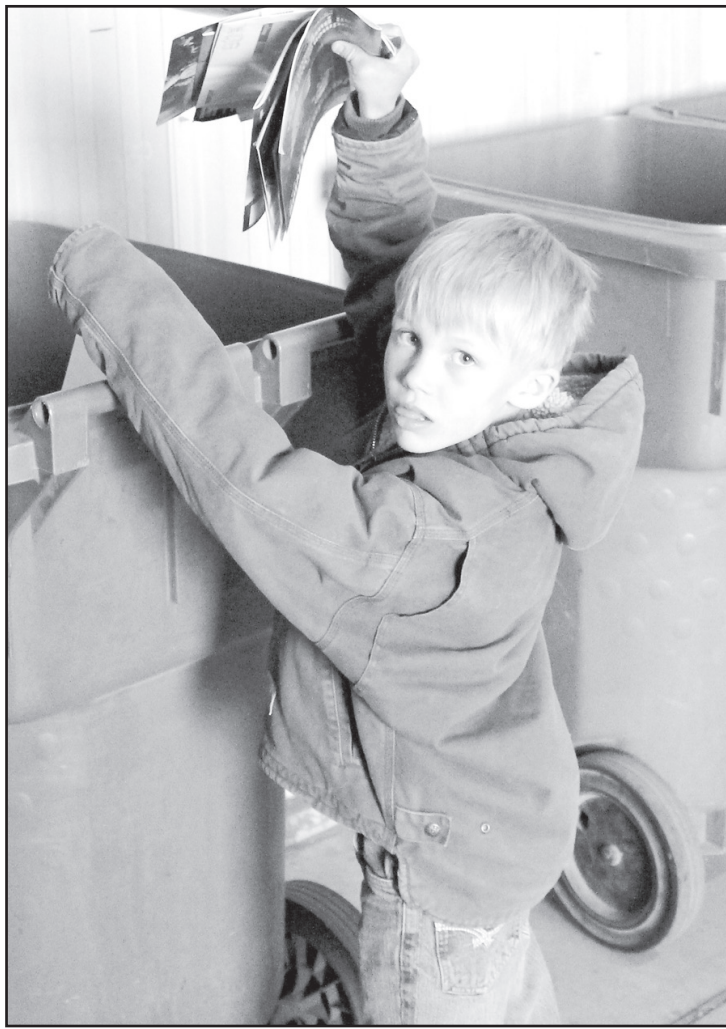
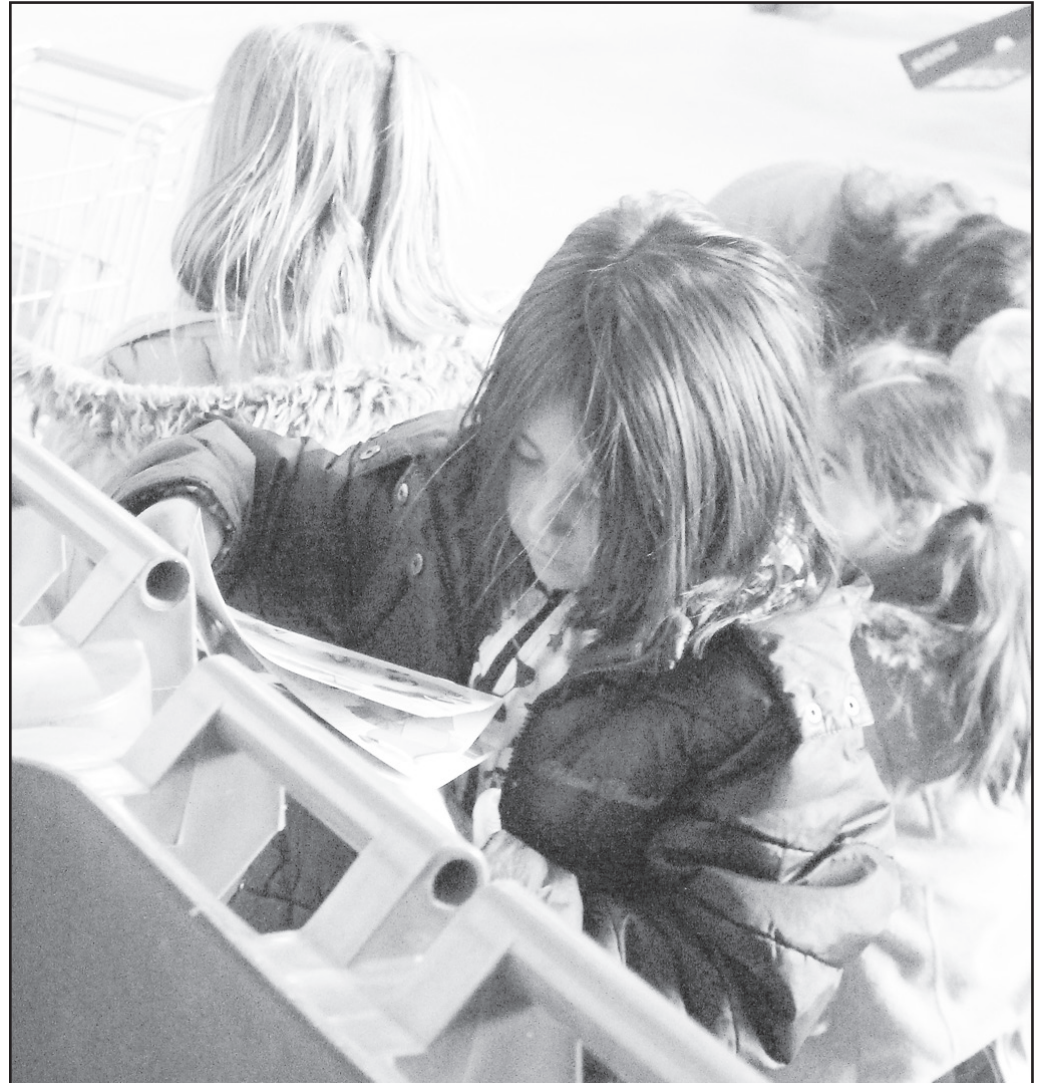
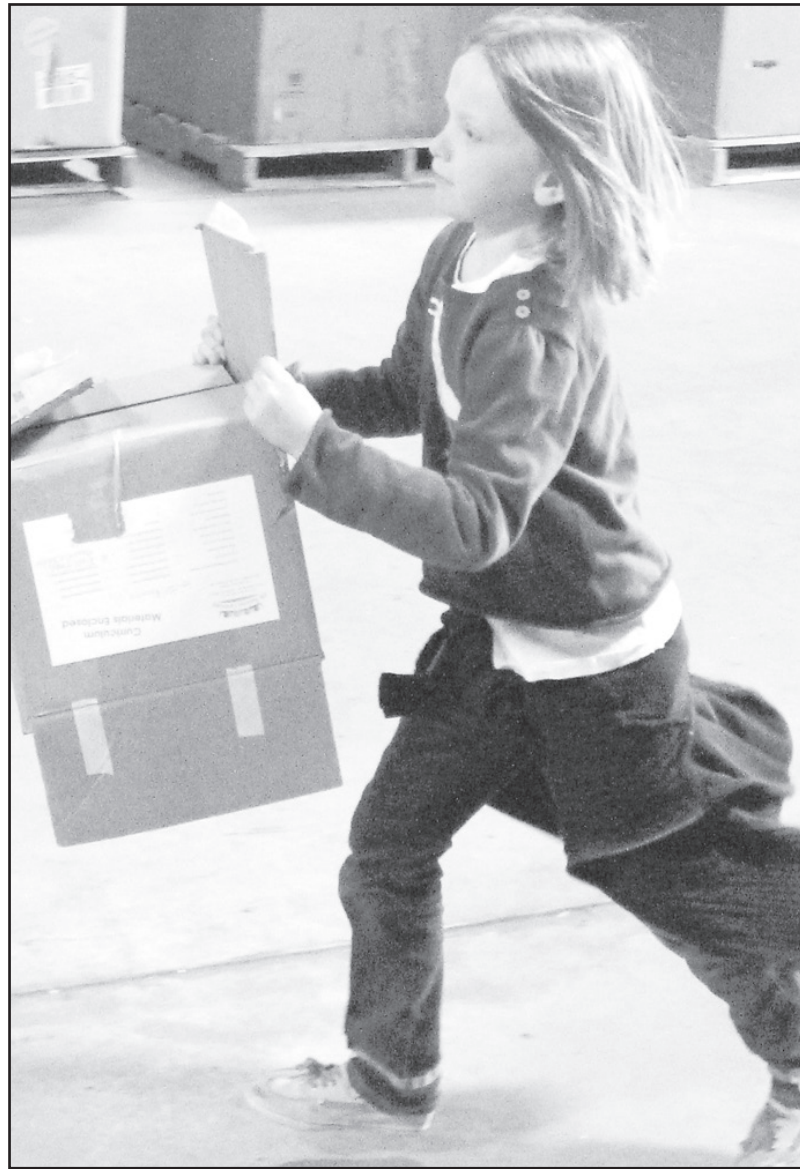


Kindergartners take trip to recycle center

Obituary

May Elois Klinzmann

May 7, 1920 - Feb. 6, 2014

May Elois Klinzmann, 93, died on Feb. 6, 2014, while sleeping peacefully.

Born May Elois Pellett in Seattle, Wash., on May 7, 1920, dear mother, grandmother, great-grandmother and aunt was the second of two children of the Rev. Claude and Milla (Ingebrigtsen) Pellett, who moved to Parkland, an outlying community of Tacoma, Wash., where May attended Parkland Elementary School, Stewart Junior High School in Tacoma, and graduated high school at Pacific Lutheran Academy in Parkland. She took courses in general studies and art for a year at Pacific Lutheran College, now Pacific Lutheran

University, in Parkland.

During World War II, while working in a box factory in Tacoma, she volunteered at the Lutheran Serviceman's Center, helping her father provide comfort and pastoral ministry for departing and returning military personnel. It was there that she met a young farmer/soldier, John H. Klinzmann, from Cheyenne County, Kan., who shared her faith in Jesus Christ, love for music, dancing, singing, bike-riding and country lifestyles.

On March 6, 1946, John's birthday, they were united in marriage at her childhood home with her father, Rev. Pellet, officiating. They began

their life together in Lake City, Wash., where May gave birth to and provided stay-at-home motherhood to a daughter in 1947 and a son in 1950, moved to South Tacoma in 1957, back to rural Cheyenne County in 1970 following John's retirement, then settled in Haigler, Neb., in 1972.

In 2000, they moved to nearby Wray, Colo., where John died in 2001. In 2003, May moved to Lewistown, Mont., to be in the company of her daughter, grandchildren and great-grandchildren, and to be surrounded by the familiarity of mountains and evergreen trees as she was in her childhood.

She is survived by her daughter,

Joan (Jerry) Gertge of Lewistown; her son, Arthur (Suzanne) Klinzmann of Fort Collins, Colo.; nine grandchildren, 12 great-grandchildren, two nieces and a host of relatives and friends.

May was preceded in death by her husband, her parents and one sister, June Pellett.

Services for May were on Feb. 26 in the First Baptist Church with interment in the Lewistown City Cemetery. Friends are asked to make memorials to Bethphage Mission of Axtell, Neb., and they may be left at the Cloyd Funeral Home.
