published the book, Memories & Musings from Residents of the Good Samaritan Village, available through the Cheyenne County Historical Society.

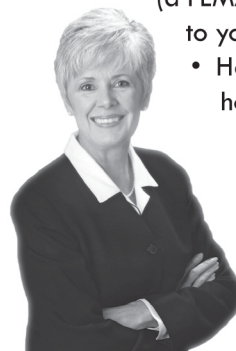
