## Administrator meets with commissioners

Les Lacy, interim administrator of the Cheyenne County Hospital, reported for April included: 3,445 outpatients; 32 inpatients; 66 emergency room visits; 641 patients at the rural health clinic; 17 surgeries, and 88 people seeing doctors in the specialty clinics.

He said an interim clinic manager had been hired. Dr. Mary Beth Miller, Mr.


