Administrator meets with commissioners

The hospital's interim administrator gave his monthly report when the Cheyenne County Commissioners met on Thursday, May 15.

Les Lacy, interim administrator of the Cheyenne County Hospital, reported for April included: 3,445 outpatients; 32 inpatients; 66 emergency room visits; 641 patients at the rural health clinic; 17 surgeries, and 88 people seeing doctors in the specialty clinics.

He said an interim clinic manager had been hired.

Dr. Mary Beth Miller, Mr.

Lacy said, has agreed to stay at the hospital until Dr. Dallas Walz arrives in August 2015. Dr. Megan Brown will begin practicing in the county on Aug. 10 of this year.

He then talked about Great Plains Health Alliance, the company which leases the hospital. Last year, he said, a health insurance premium holiday saved the hospital \$33,000. Employees saved \$12,000. The total, he said, was a savings of \$45,008.

The purchasing group saved not 2 percent over the next best competitor, but 8 percent. On \$1 million in supply costs, he said, this represents a savings of \$80,000.

My service as interim administrator, Mr. Lacy said, will save the hospital about \$10,000 per month. These savings alone exceed the cost of the lease with Great Plains which is \$71,678.

Roxie Neitzel, hospital board member, was also present at the commissioners meeting for Mr. Lacy's report.

June 6 marks the 70th anniversary of Normandy Beach. Katherine Lorio, history teacher at Westfield High School, Chantilly, Va., and her student, Aditya Sapre are one of 15 teacher-student pairs that have been selected to travel and take part in lectures and visit memorials about Normandy.
