City councilman and pool committee member Bruce Swihart explained that the city pool received a face lift this year. There was a lot more work done to the pool, and the city contracted a specialist to do the work. On top of that, unfavorable spring weather pushed back the opening of the pool.

"It all boils down to the fact that we can only get so much done with the amount of time and the weather conditions we are given," Mr. Swihart said.

This year, for the first time in over 10 years, the pool was sandblasted and stripped down to resurface. The city hired an experienced professional to sand-

She has not gotten them from the Red Cross the previous two years.

Council members agreed she should attempt to get the certificates, but were all in agreement that they wanted her to continue to teach with the same lesson plans in mind. Even without the Red Cross certificates, the children will receive a certificate from Ms. Marin stating what skill sets the child has mastered.
