The new baby queen had two sets of grandparents living not far away. The grandparents let her enjoy their player piano and their stereoscope (an instrument with two eye pieces that gives a three-dimensional effect).

She also played the Victrola phonograph with a disc on top of the cabinet and a crank on the side. The record played “Bringing in the Sheaves” as long as she kept turning the crank.

It was very special for her to be allowed to play with Auntie's beautiful doll, which was always kept in a box with a glass lid for viewing. It was locked for safety.

Report annual acreage

Cheyenne County Farm Service Agency Executive Director Ross B. Sloan reminds agriculture producers that July 15, 2014, is the deadline to file an acreage report for spring seeded crops. Planted acres must be reported by July 15. The Agricultural Act of 2014 (2014 Farm Bill) requires producers on a farm to submit annual acreage reports on all cropland.

“Although some federal farm program enrollments have not yet started, timely acreage reports for all crops and land uses, including prevented and failed acreage that producers submit to their local FSA office, are important to ensure program eligibility,” said Sloan.

Acreage reports are considered timely filed when completed by the applicable final crop reporting deadline, which may vary from state to state. Producers who do not enroll by the July 15 deadline are subject to late-filing requirements. Producers should contact their local office for an appointment to provide an accurate acreage report of their spring-seeded crops.

For questions on this or any Farm Service Agency program, including specific crop reporting deadlines and planting dates, producers should contact their county Farm Service Agency office or seek information online at www.fsa.usda.gov.
