Cheyenne County feels some cooler weather than usual in July

The temperatures last week has many people checking their calendars to make sure they didn't skip a few months. It certainly felt more like fall than mid-summer

Last week St. Francis had high of only 64 degrees last Wednesday, and only 68 on Thursday. However by Sunday the high reached all the way up to 103.

Cheyenne County was not the only area of Kansas, or the United States for that matter, that got to enjoy unseasonably cool weather. Records were made across the state for the coolest maximum temperature and record low temperatures.

Last Tuesday Goodland, the National Weather Service's local forecast center, tied it's record setting lowest maximum temperature of 69 degrees. The old record was set in 1972. The next day brought even cooler temperatures across the area.




