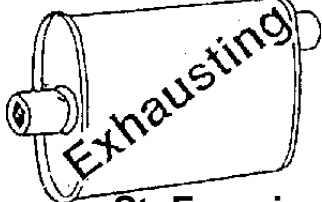

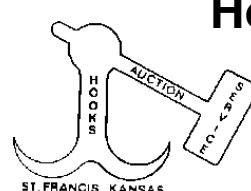

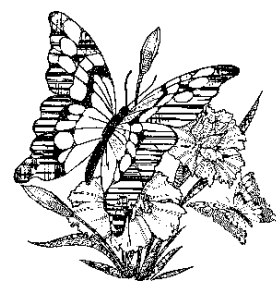

Book Review

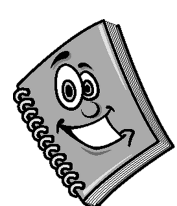
Book review from the St. Francis Public Library
Tales of Burning Love
By Louise Erdrich

In her boldest and most darkly humorous novel yet, award-winning, critically acclaimed, and bestselling novelist Louise Erdrich tells the intimate and powerful stories of five Great Plains women whose lives are connected through one man.

A highway and snowy field just outside of Fargo, N.D., becomes an arena in which no encounter is meaningless, no event without echo, no simple hope impossible to realize. Stranded together in a blizzard, each of Jack Mauser's former wives tells the secret tale of burning love that will save her. Their stories repair wounded hearts as their revelations, both comic and painful, blast through the walls between them.

Jack Mauser is a big and passionate man. Though initially central to each woman's tale, during a long night of shared confidences he becomes peripheral to their feelings for one another. There is Eleanor, spoiled, sensual, brainy; Candice, both tougher and more vulnerable than she can admit, especially once she is faced with her attraction to another woman; Marlis, a single mother caught up in a cycle of conflicting wishes; and Dot, both true and desperate, Jack's last and fiercest wife.

Tales of Burning Love is the jumbled shadow of dreams both individual and collective. It is the struggle to be heard above the din and it is the rush of hearing. Hugely comic, deeply tender, it is finally about the mystery of how we all come to strive, to hope and to love.



Residents are warned to watch for snakes

It's that time of year again when we all get itchy to be outside, enjoying the sunshine, working in the yard, and beginning the fieldwork. But, it is not only people that are coming outside in spring; snakes as well are awakening from their long winter hibernation. There are 6 to 8,000 poisonous snakebites a year and the majority are from rattlesnakes. The rattlesnake is considered a pit viper along with the copperhead and the cottonmouth or water moccasin.

Living in prairie country, we are a prime location for rattlers. Rattlesnakes are recognizable by their flat, diamond-shaped head and may have a diamond gray/brown pattern of coloration. They tend to be found in high grasses or sunning themselves on rocks or roadways. Most rattlesnakes will only strike if they are cornered. They will warn animals and humans of their presence with

the rhythmic shaking of their tale, which produces their heart-stopping rattle.

In the event that this snake strikes you, it is important to seek health care immediately. However, here are some things you can do right away:

- Get away from the snake. If someone is trying to help you or you are trying to help someone else, be sure the scene is safe so no one else is struck.
- Don't run or get more excited than you already are, this increases the spread of the venom through your body. Most times the bites are on the arm, hand, leg, or foot. The best thing is to keep the extremity or bite site very still and below the level of your heart.
- Remove any constricting bands from the bitten extremity; it will swell.
- Lay down flat and send someone for help if you are not alone. If you are, walk calmly to your vehicle and

call for help or drive to someone who can take you to the hospital. Remember, you want to remain as calm as possible and keep the bite as immobile as you can.

Things you should not do:

- Place a constricting band or tourniquet above the bite, this will only cause more tissue damage.
- Attempt to suck the venom out of the bite. This will only expose you or another person to the venom. It does not work.
- Do not put ice on the bite.
- If you do bring the snake to health care, please kill it first. Be aware that snakes can still inject venom from their fangs even though they are dead. There will be muscle spasms after the snake is killed so please, be careful.
- Snakebite reactions can develop over time. Snakes can inject minimal to large amounts of venom into your body. Mild symptoms may be local swelling and pain, general

weakness and tiredness and nausea. Severe symptoms include vomiting, sweating, blurred vision, numbness and seizures. Seek medical attention as quickly as possible even if you do not experience immediate symptoms.

The best treatment for snakebites is prevention. Be aware that rattlesnakes are prevalent in Cheyenne County and be observant for them when walking in high grass and in other places they can be found. If you hear the warning rattle, move to a less threatening location. Remember that they mostly strike when they feel cornered.

Spring is here and it is a joy to be outdoors, just please be cautious of the reptiles that are enjoying the weather too!
