Nathan Hays has worked on his rodeo skills for years, and it looks like it has paid off. He is competing in the College Nation Finals Rodeo this week.

Hays, a senior at Northwestern Oklahoma State University and a 1996 Goodland High School graduate, is wrestling steers with the best college athletes in the country.

He has three tries in the event, also known as "bulldoggin," to qualify for the final round on Saturday. He wrestled his first steer in 5.7 seconds

to put himself in 11th place, and tied up the second in 8.0. His third steer will be today, in the contest scheduled to start at 5:30 p.m. If he scores well enough, he will get to show off his skills on pay-per-view television.

Hays qualified for nationals by placing fifth in the Central Plains region. There are 11 regions in the National Intercollegiate Rodeo Association, and more than 3,300 men and women competed this year. Only about 250 made it to the finals in Casper, Wyo.

Hays is no stranger to national competition. His mother, Connie Hays, said he competed all through high

school, and in the high school national finals. He rode for the Colby Community College team when he went to that school.

Besides steer wrestling, she said, he also competes in team roping, but his team did not qualify for regionals this year.

Jessica Hays, Nathan's sister and a sophomore at the same university, went to the national finals last year in goat tying, her mother said, and just barely missed out this year.

"We are a real rodeo family," Connie said.
