

Cheylin swim team ends season at championship meet in McCook

On Saturday, July 13, the Qualifying Meet was held in Benkelman, Neb. Swimmers from eight different teams competed for top spots. To automatically qualify you must finish first, second or third. Then the rest of the teams are pooled together to get the top 16 times.

Seven of the 22 Cheylin kids automatically qualified. They are Sara Moore, Hayley Young, Brandi Moore, Kori Underwood, Jill Zumbahlen, Taylor Leibbrandt and Stephanie Busse. The entire team had a great meet. The Championship Meet will be held on Saturday July 20, in McCook, Neb.

Cheylin swim team breaks two records

On Saturday, July 20, swimmers from 22 teams gathered for the most important meet of the season. Cheylin ended up with 573 team points to put them in 11th place. Alma took first with 1176 points, Arapahoe, second with 845 points and Cambridge, third with 736. The kids did very well considering how hot it was that day.

Cheylin set two new records. Jeff Klippert set one in the mens 30-and-over breaststroke with a time of 19.38; the old time was 20.13. The second record was set with the 19-and-over girls free relay (Hayley Young, Sara Moore, Jill Zumbahlen and Brandi Moore). Their time of 61.23 beat the old time of 61.69.

Hayley and Brandi both received second place with overall points.

Hunter safety course to be offered

According to the law, people who are 27 years old or younger and want to hunt must carry a certification card along with their hunting license. Certification cards can be obtained only after the individual has completed a hunter education course and all hunters who were born on or after July 1,

1957, must complete the course. There is only one course offered each year in St. Francis. That course, held through the Kansas Wildlife and Parks, and again sponsored by Gardner Graphics will be held from 7 to 9 p.m. on Aug. 15 and 16 and at 9 a.m. on Aug. 17. The Saturday class

will last much of the day. There is no charge for the class. The classes are held at the St. Francis Grade School in St. Francis. This year the class is being limited to 30 and those interested will need to pre-register by calling Chet Gardner at (785) 332-2373. The recommended age for the class is 12 years to adult but those younger will not be turned away. Others who have previously taken the class might want to renew their hunting knowledge and skills by taking the class. Instructors for the class are Chet Gardner, Tim Stimbirt, Dick Rohweder, Bob Burr and Greg Wright.
