Kennedy (CV 67) in support of Operation Enduring Freedom from February to August 2002. Petty Officer Moore consistently performed his demanding duties in an exemplary and highly professional manner. Demonstrating outstanding initiative and technical expertise, he trained and assisted 12 personnel during the production of 12 cruise music videos of several evolutions throughout the ship during John F. Kennedy Battle Group deployment.

"Additionally, his expertise was instrumental to divisional personnel becoming proficient with state-of-the-art digital video editing system, greatly enhancing the morale of the crew. Petty Officer Moore's exceptional professionalism and selfless devotion to duty reflected credit upon him and the United States Naval Service."

Kennedy and her embarked Carrier Air Wing Seven (CVW-7) have been conducting combat missions in support of Operation Enduring Freedom since early February and the Kennedy has been the only U.S. Carrier supporting the operation since April.

19, by the USS George Washington (CVN 73) Carrier Battle Group, and have returned to their homeport Naval Station in Mayport, Fla.

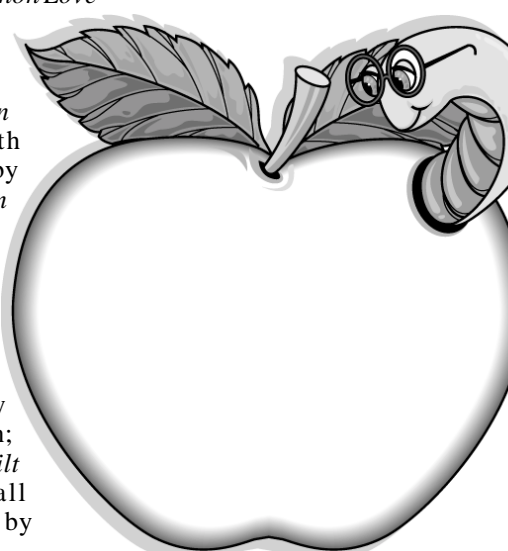

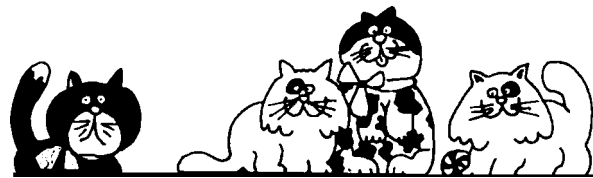

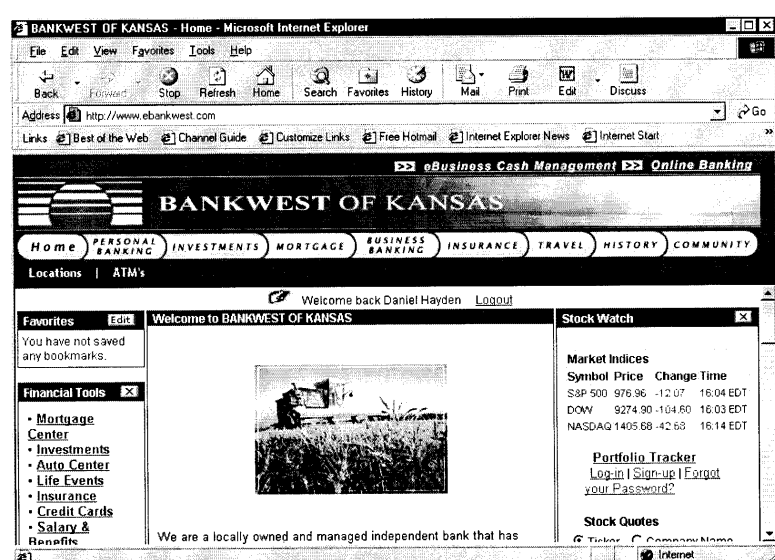
