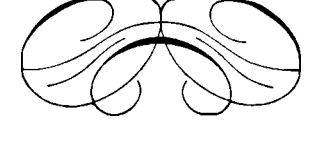

Genealogy Korner

Last week we learned about the Solomon Walter family. We had suspected Solomon was a brother of Tobias Walter who still has descendants in Cheyenne county, but we were not sure about it. They are the sons of Daniel Walter and Ursula Spornslin who had at least nine children. Solomon and his wife Mary Schwaninger lost two daughters in 1895 and they are believed to be buried in the Tarpley cemetery. So far, the family does not know the names of these two girls. Solomon made the coffins for the daughters, what a sad work to do. Another brother Simon was also here, and believed to have married Elizabeth Wuest, however, there is a note that the marriage

license was cancelled. The mysteries we find when we look up family history! Later census records do give his wife the name of Elizabeth. Alfred Walter also lived in the same area, and lost a son Eddie in 1895, also believed to be buried in the Tarpley cemetery. The family who contacted us did not recognize this name in their genealogy. In an early census record, another son was named Martin, could this possibly be John Martin Walter who also lived in the northwest part of the county? Does someone know about these families? We appreciate learning about them and getting our family files more complete. We would like to welcome you to join our Historical Society to help preserve our history.
