

Lady Indians win over Hoxie

Indians kick off the season with win against Bridgeport

The Indian football team kicked into high gear in the second quarter and went on to defeat the Bridgeport Bulldogs 38-0 in the opening game of the season played at Bridgeport, Neb., on Friday.

The Indians again this year added a game to the win column in their opening contest.

Head coach Tim Lambert emphasizes keeping in shape all 12 months of the year and the players worked hard during opening workouts to be in top form.
