She is the co-founder of Boulder's Share A Gift Inc., a non-profit community program that collects and distributes toys to the needy children.  
Dr. Joselyn is the daughter of Jim and Josephine Cram, formerly of St. Francis, and the niece of Dr. and Mrs. Richard Cram, St. Francis.
