Oberlin did not score on the young Indians until the final second of the game.

"This was a good effort by all and a good way to start the season," Coach Ted Busse said.

The game was played in St. Francis and the home crowd was appreciative of the Indians' effort.

Saintry scored a touchdown in both the first and second quarters to go up 12-0 by halftime. They then scored on the opening drive of the second half and found the end zone one more time before the quarter ended to make the score 28-0 after three periods.

Oberlin completed a half-back pass from 35-yard out to get on the scoreboard before the game ended.

The Saintry score in the first period

came on an Andrew Feikert 3-yard run with Derek Ross adding the touchdown in the second quarter on an 8-yard run.

During the third quarter, Ross again hit pay dirt, this time with a 28-yard run and he also added two points on a conversion run following the touchdown. By this time Saintry was ahead 20-0.

Feikert scored again on a 12-yard run later in the third quarter and Dylan Loyd was the running back who had a successful two-point conversion run.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 428 OF ARTICLE 4 OF CHAPTER 15 OF THE 1994 CODE OF THE CITY OF ST. FRANCIS, KANSAS, REPEALING ORDINANCE NUMBER 506 AND ESTABLISHING NEW SEWER SERVICES CHARGES IN THE CITY OF ST. FRANCIS, KANSAS

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF ST. FRANCIS, KANSAS, that Ordinance number 506 is hereby repealed and that Section 428 of Article 4, Chapter 15 of the 1994 Code of the City of St. Francis, Kansas, and entitled "SEWER SERVICE CHARGE", shall be amended to read as follows:

15-428 SEWER SERVICE CHARGE. The rates of service charges to be paid to the city for the use of the sewer system of said city by all persons, city department, the United States of America, the State of Kansas, and its political subdivisions and any organization whose premises are connected to the sanitary sewer system of said city shall be payable monthly for each month or fraction thereof, and shall be:

- (a) For each residence \$13.20;
- (b) For each residence occupied by the owner thereof, having one apartment therein \$16.20;
- (c) For each residence occupied by the owner thereof, having two apartments \$19.20;
- (d) For each commercial place of business, not otherwise classified in this article \$13.20;
- (e) For each apartment house having three apartments or less \$19.20;
- (f) For each commercial place of business maintaining a wash rack or facilities for washing or serving motor vehicles \$30.00;
- (g) For trailer courts, motels, hotels and apartment houses having six units or less \$40.00;
- (h) For trailer courts, motels, hotels and apartment houses having more than six units or apartments and coin operated laundries \$50.00;
- (i) For the Cheyenne County Courthouse \$60.00;
- (j) For schools, hospitals, and rest homes \$100.00;
- (k) The rates specified above for various types of property shall prevail outside the city limits, except that a surcharge of \$10.00 shall be made.

This Section 15-428, as amended, shall take effect September 16, 2002, and be enforced from and after its publication in the official city newspaper, **The St. Francis Herald**.
