The team was 87 percent on their hitting attempts with three players having 100 percent: Fiedler (10 successful hits); Raile (5) and Meredith Knodel (1).

The two main setters, Fiedler and Feikert again had a good match with the team being 98 percent on either good or playable sets.

Culwell had 16 passing attempts with 13 of them being good. The passing was pretty evenly divided with Andrist having 14, Feikert and Raile 13 each and Coates and Fiedler 12 each to be the team leaders

"We executed very well down the stretch in the Atwood match to win," Coach Kechter said. "Heather (Culwell) got on a roll with the attack due to some great passing and setting by her teammates. It was nice to see us execute so well when the pressure was on."

"In the Sharon Springs match we did most things well, but we just couldn't quite get the victory,' Coach Kechter said.




Idalia's points came on a Rittenhouse to Terrell 16-yard pass play. Even though Deertrail scored once more they could not overcome the Wolves.
