Residents can register to vote till October 21

Terry Miller, election officer, announced that people can register to vote during regular business hours at the office of the county clerk at the courthouse; the city clerk's office at 113 W. Washington, both in St. Francis; and, in Bird City, at the First National Bank on Bird Avenue. However, the registration books will close at the end of the day on Oct. 21 and remain closed through the day of the general election on Nov. 5.

When a voter has registered, his or her registration will be valid until the voter changes their name by marriage, divorce or legal pro-

ceedings or changed the place where they are living.

Those who will need to register are citizens 18 years of age and upwards or will have attained the age of 18 at the next election or those who have changed their name or place of residence. The person can register by applying to the election officer in person or by mail. Application forms shall be provided by the election officer upon request.

Those not registering before Oct. 21 may register after the election as the books will once again open on Nov. 6.

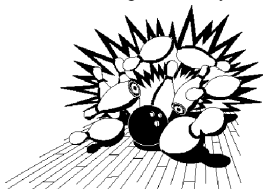
