Parks, Neb., on Oct. 22, 1923, as the third son of Daniel Morgan and Ruby Elverda Winton. Harold moved to a farm in northeast Cheyenne County, Kan., with his family when he was a small boy and spent most of his younger years there with his parents and his brothers Joe, Burman and Daniel and his sister Wilma.

Harold led the life of a Kansas farm boy growing up in the 20s and 30s which meant saddle horses, herding cattle, raising crops and generally working from daylight to dark. He and his brother Burman were daredevils in and out of the saddle. Many of his best stories were about this time of his life which was filled with the adventure of growing up in an era of change from the horse-drawn world to the world of machines. He rode most everything and could drive any-

As a young man, Harold went to serve his country in World War II. Just before he shipped overseas he and his sweetheart Bettye Wiggins were married in Goodland on Sept. 23, 1944. Harold went to Europe with the 18th Armored Battalion and fought in General George Patton's Third Army as well as the First and Ninth Armies in France, Luxemborg, Belgium and Germany. Harold was wounded in action on April 9, 1945, and returned home to his wife Bettye with several medals and many, many stories about his experiences.

Harold and Bettye lived the rest of their adult lives in St. Francis. Harold was a rural mail carrier, farmer and school bus driver. They had four children Steven, Kevin, Kimberly and Shana who all grew up and were educated in St. Francis. Harold's life as a husband, father and grandfather produced another whole group of stories about things like - tickle hill, Hildeguarde the 1943 Chevy truck, wheat harvest and combines that worked sometimes, snowstorms and snow drifts, flat tires and driving with his left hand and left foot while sitting in the middle of the

Harold retired in 1981 and spent many pleasurable hours at the Riverside golf course and at the bowling alley with his family and friends. He and Bettye did travel some as well, although a week away from home was a long time for

In 1999, Harold and Bettye moved from their home of 44 years on East Second Street to a smaller retirement home on Parkway Drive.

Harold's health declined steadily after this due to chronic emphysema and he died on Sept. 27, 2002, at 78 years and 11 months of age.

Harold was a person who relished life and all of its adventures, one who could tell a story and make you laugh or make a point. He loved his family dearly and was proud of every accomplishment of all of his children, grandchildren and one great-grandchild to whom he was a very special father and grandfather


