On Oct. 11, an officer investigated a report of kids riding skateboards on U.S. 36 west of the golf course.

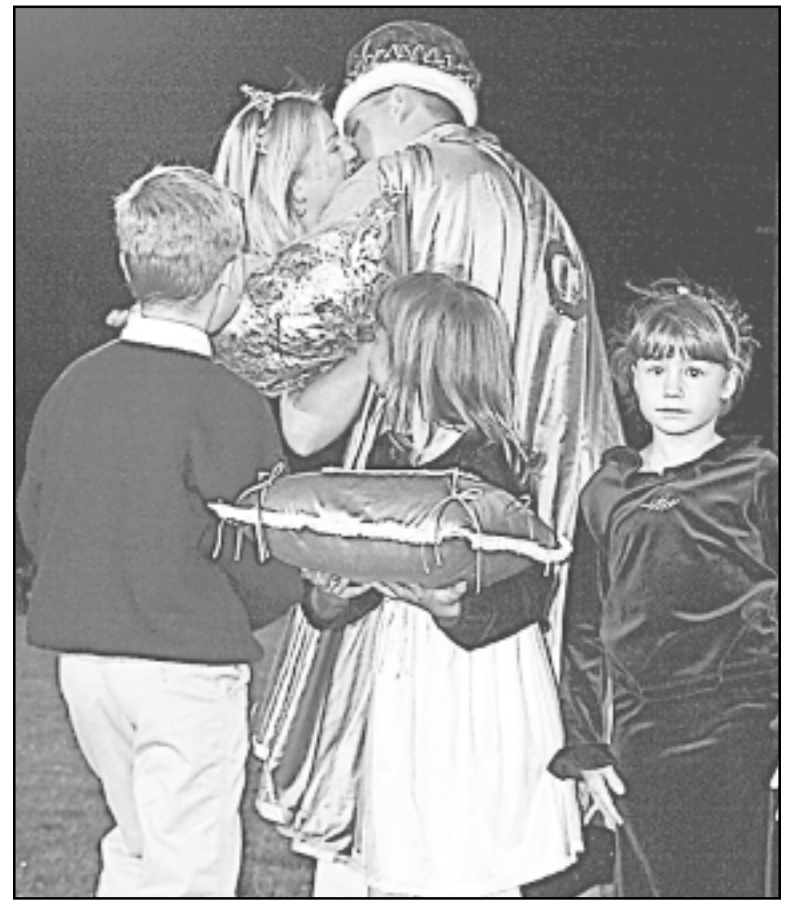
