Sainty high school recognized by Kansas State Task Force

The St. Francis Community High School principal has been notified that the school has received the Certificate of Recognition in behalf of

the Confidence in Kansas Public Education Task Force.

Principal Scott "Hoagie" Carmichael reported that the school was honored as a result of its performance on the 11th grade reading assessments.

The award recognizes schools for outstanding achievement and uncommon accomplishment based on the Kansas Assessment results from 2002 and other qualifying factors, taking in consideration the sample size, ethnicity and socio-economic status of those taking the test.

Principal Carmichael reported that this award is new. However, the St. Francis school has earned outstanding assessment awards in the past and has almost always been above the state average.

"Our overall system and staff is a direct indication of why our kids do well at the state level," he said. "And, it all goes back to the same thing — being able to read well has an effect on every subject whether it is shop or English. We read for meaning instead of just reading words and it shows in the assessments."

The Confidence in Kansas Public Education Task Force was es-

tablished 21 years ago to promote Kansas schools and their achievements. It sponsors the Governor's Scholars Banquet held each spring that recognizes the top 1 percent of graduating seniors.

It also annually honors individuals, organizations and businesses that actively support public education with the Friends of Education Award.

The ABC Award is another Task Force honor that goes each year to an outstanding individual or organization whose influence has been felt statewide. The 2002 recipient was I.B. "Sonny" Rundell, Kansas State Board of Education member from the 10th District and current board chair.

Eight statewide organizations comprise the Task Force.
