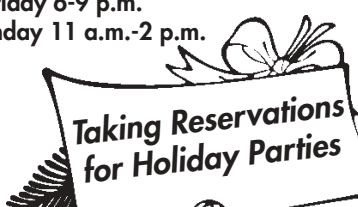

Health nurse completing bio-terrorism plans

Susan Roelfs, county health nurse, reported on the bio-terrorism plans she has prepared for Cheyenne County. The second draft was submitted and signed by the Commissioner Ron Krien at the Thursday meeting.

The Sept. 11 attack on the Trade Center, New York, brought about the need to be prepared in case there is another attack. Another terrorist attack has been predicted and agencies across the United States are working together to have bio-terrorism plans in place.

The public health preparedness inventory had been completed and is intact. The areas which she will now focus on include:

- The communication system and

the board okayed the purchase of a two-radio with 911 funds.

- A security system.
- Education on infectious disease.
- National Pharmacy stockpile distribution.
- Active surveillance system for infectious disease.
- Safety and protection of healthcare workers.

Following the completion of an approved plan, funds will be received. These funds are provided by the federal government and then are given to the states to trickle down to the counties as requirements are met.

Nurse Roelfs reported that regionalization of nine counties including Cheyenne County has been made

and a meeting was held in Norton on Oct. 28. The Norton County Health Department volunteered to be the coordinator site.

Flu vaccine

The county health nurse reported that there is still flu vaccine available. "The public is encouraged to take the vaccine soon," she said. The vaccine takes two to four weeks to develop protection against the flu virus.

In order to make the vaccine more available to working people, after hours has been scheduled with the clinic until 7:30 p.m. on Mondays, Nov. 11 and Nov. 18 and from 9 to noon on Saturday, Nov. 23.

Reports of the Food Pantry for the coming holiday season

Reva Pownell, coordinator for the county Food Pantry, informed the Cheyenne County Commissioners at their Thursday meeting that when she took over the pantry over a year ago, there was only about three sacks of groceries and very little in the fund at the grocery store. The items in the Food Pantry are used to help those in need or just needing a little boost — "no one should be hungry," Mrs. Pownell has said.

Since the sheriff office personnel is mostly responsible for giving out food, the Pantry is located in the courthouse near the jail. When the few items were moved to the top floor room which is just a very small area, there was plenty of room but when people were made aware of the needs of the Pantry, the food began arriving and, before long, the shelves were full and there were boxes located on the floor.

Mrs. Pownell had asked for a larger room including the holding cell which is much larger. However, since there might be a need for the holding cell,

that area was no longer available and there just doesn't seem to be any other space. Because it is so hot in the Pantry during the summer months, there was some items which had to be thrown out because they had become buggy. She had been notified that Mary Bier at Sears had a good used refrigerator which dry foods could be stored so she began talking to people and, as usual, there were people out there who agreed to donate money but she was still short \$35. But, the commissioners, since the Pantry is not officially a "county-funded project" said that they could not give to the fund but would try to find more room for the pantry.

Before Mrs. Pownell left, she told the commissioners about the upcoming seasons and how baskets were filled and delivered. She asked that they allow her to use the holding cell for one or two days to fill the baskets during the Thanksgiving and Christmas seasons and the commissioners okayed the request.

Commissioner Jane Brubaker told

the Pantry coordinator that Bird City, which covers the Cheylin School District, had its own food delivery for the need. Mrs. Pownell said they would not plan to go over there but would also talk to Pastor Doug Mason who is in charge of the Bird City's food drive.
