# 4-H'ers tag Christmas trees

Lawn Ridge 4-H Club members want every homeowner to

have a safe holiday season. On Nov. 29, 10 members went out to the farm of Todd and Tracy Neitzel (where they are selling Christmas trees and wreaths), to tie tags with safe tips on each Christmas tree and wreath to inform the purchaser of some safety tips.

Safety tips attached to the trees in-


- 1. Keep the tree away from heat
- 2. Check strands of lights on extension cords before putting them on the tree. Check for loose sockets and frayed wires. Use only UL approved
- 3. Never use indoor lights outdoors. Cover outdoor plugs and connections that are touching the ground.
- 4. Keep lights and cords away from the tree's water supply.
- 5. Use no more than three sets of lights on each extension cord.
- 6. If you have an artificial plastic tree, use only midget lights designed for those trees. Note: These midget lights usually push in. Do not twist
- 7. Metal trees should be floodlighted
- 8. Never leave the tree unattended.
