



I certainly hope that this deer season will be a learning experience for many of our Kansas deer hunters. I am sure a lot of you saw some illegal activity, some unethical behavhunt but they support those of us ior and a good dose of unsportsmanlike conduct. If our hunting seasons are to continue, we are all going to have to work together to gain back control of our firearms deer season.
