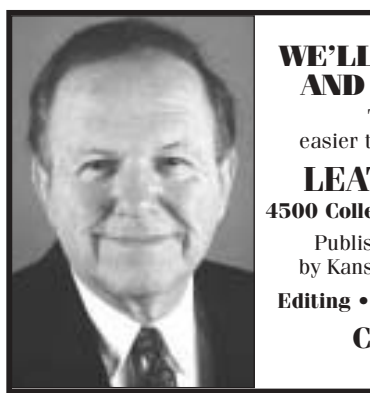

Of the cookie sale proceeds, 23 percent stays with the local troops to finance activities; 23 percent underwrites a variety of year-round activities for all program levels; 18 percent is spent on a variety of equipment; 6 percent is designated for cookie dough coupons which are given to individual girls and can be spent on Girl Scout items, event fees, dues and to attend any Girl Scout camp; 17 percent is used to provide additional financial assistance through a Grants for Girls fund; 8 percent buys summer camping equipment and program supplies for the council camps that are held at the Dane Hansen Scout Reservation on Lake Kirwin; and 5 percent supports the council endowment fund.

This team works extremely hard in practice and several of them have spent a lot of time playing on their own. I am confident we will continue to get better throughout the season and will be very competitive in our future games.
