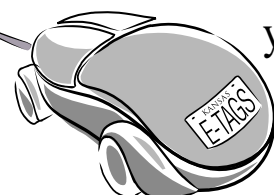

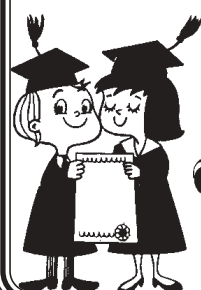

Ladies win two games

Earlier this month, St. Francis took a slim two-point win over Sharon Springs in basketball action, but on Tuesday, Feb. 11, the Lady Indians defeated the Lady Wildcats 56-42.

St. Francis added another win to their record on Friday evening when they posted a 38-27 Northwest Kansas League victory over Atwood.

Friday night the Ladies finished their regular season home schedule with seniors Kelsey Andrist, Samantha Coates, Amber Feikert, Gina Frohlich and Dennon Zimbelman, along with their parents, recognized following the win over Atwood. This group of girls have represented St. Francis in athletic endeavors for a number of years.

With one more regular-season game on the calendar, St. Francis has a 9-9 overall record.

St. Francis 56, Sharon Springs 42

During the second half of the game, the two teams were nearly even with Sainty collecting 24 points and Sharon Springs 26, but St. Francis had a 32-16 margin at half time and continued playing well enough to score the win.

Putting seven two-pointers through the hoop in the first period gave the Lady Indians a margin to work on. Coates and Frohlich each had two successful shots while Meredith Knodel, Andrist and Kandee Raile had one apiece.

During the second frame, Toni Rice and Coates scored outside the arc for three-point shots, and this was added to baskets by Feikert, Ashley Holzwarth and Allyse Lampe plus two free throws each by Feikert and Andrist to give the Indians double the points that the Lady Wildcats had (32-16).

"We played a pretty good all-around game!" Coach Ted Busse said. "I was pleased with the girls' efforts."

Andrist led the scoring with 14 points with the team as a whole having 32 percent success from the field and 50 percent from the line. Coates ended the night with a perfect 100 percent from the field being 3-of-3 from two-point range and 1-of-1 from three-point range.

Knodel had a good percentage from the field 66.7 (2/3). The team hit 2-of-3 long-range attempts.

Having the best percentage (66.7) from the free-throw line were Andrist with 6-of-9 and Feikert with 2-of-3.

"We shot the ball well from the field and we really rebounded better than the last couple of games," Coach Busse said.

Sainty had 42 rebounds compared to 22 for the Lady Wildcats. Ten Sainty players collected at least one rebound with Andrist having

eight and Frohlich seven.

One of the plus signs for the game was the number of assists, 14, showing the ball was getting into the open player. Frohlich led with three while Coates led in steals with three and Andrist had three blocked shots.

St. Francis 38, Atwood 27

The contest with the Lady Buffs was a Northwest Kansas League competition, giving St. Francis a league win. The final score was 38-27 with Atwood unable to counter the attack of the Lady Indians in the fourth quarter.

Although St. Francis had pulled ahead early, Atwood moved closer as the second period progressed. St. Francis just couldn't get the ball to fall through the hoop in the minutes before halftime. When the two teams went into the locker room the score stood 19-19. In the slow second period only Lampe hit a field goal while Andrist and Raile each scored on a free-throw attempt.

The third quarter again was very low scoring for both teams but the Sainty defense had an especially good fourth quarter holding the Lady Buffs to two points. It seemed

like the defense had improved throughout the game as the Atwood scoring decreased in each period. Sainty shot in double figures with 11 points in the fourth.

"This was a good win for us and a good way for us to go out on "Senior Parent Night," Coach Busse said. "I was really pleased with the girls' efforts, especially on the defensive end of the floor."

Sainty was 23.3 percent from the field and 57.1 percent from the line. Lampe was 50 percent from two-point range (1/2), Raile was 50 percent from three-point range (1/2) and Andrist was 75 percent from the free-throw line (3/4).

"We just never quit fighting and we had people really step it up at the end of the game and make some big plays," Coach Busse said. "I was also very pleased with Coach Dinkel and the junior varsity girls' efforts in the junior varsity game."

Defensively Andrist and Frohlich each had eight boards, with Raile having seven. Feikert led in assists with three and Andrist led in steals.

Only 14 fouls were called against each team during the evening.

A very slow start hurt the Indians against Sharon Springs Tuesday, Feb. 11. As a result, the Wildcats scored their second varsity boys basketball win over St. Francis this year. The final was Sharon Spring 60, St. Francis 45.

Friday night in Northwest Kansas League action the Atwood Buffs and the St. Francis Indians met in St. Francis for the final home basketball game. Atwood took home the win 73-63.

Seniors Chase Collier, Cale Rieger, Tyler Wolters and Marcus Dodd played their last home game and were recognized by St. Francis fans for their accomplishments on the hardwood court. The senior player's parents were also introduced.

St. Francis has a 7-12 record going into the Friday night game with Quinter.

Sharon Springs 60, St. Francis 45

"Our lack of ability to score early in the game set the tone," Coach Greg Wolters said. "We made one of our first 18 shots. That makes it tough. We shot a season low 28 percent from the field for the game."

To show how hard a time the Indians had scoring early the first quarter ended 18-3, with the three Sainty points coming on a basket by Marcus Dodd and a free throw by Michael Raile.

The following three quarters, the Indians scored in double figures earning a total of 42 points but playing catch up is hard to do, especially when the opponent managed 42 points in the final three frames.

Two Indians scored in double figures for the night with Tanner Kinen having 13 and Dodd 11.

Having the best percentage from two-point range was Tyler Voorhies, who was 66.7 percent making 2-of-3 attempts. The team was not very successful from three-point range making only 3-of-13 tries. Connecting once were Jonathan Roelfs, Cale Rieger and Voorhies. The team was 50 percent from the free-throw line but had only eight attempts while giving the Wildcats 26 attempts (they made 16).

"We must continue to work hard to become better shooters," Coach Wolters said.

Also helping offensively were the 15 assists the team had with Wolters leading with six.

Defensively Sainty had 33 rebounds with Sharon Springs having 38. Leading the way for Sainty was Dodd with 10. He also had four blocked shots with Kinen adding one.

"When we make some shots early, it seems we can play with anybody," Coach Wolters said. "When we don't our defense seems to suffer also. We must learn to play even better defensively when we're not shooting well."

Atwood led St. Francis 20-11 by the end of the first quarter as they came on strong offensively. By halftime the Indians, with their limited production, were down 42-20.

Sainty came back and outscored Atwood in each of the final two quarters but the deficit was too large to overcome, especially since the Buffs still produced adequately in the second half. The large cushion the Buffs had built up produced their victory.

"We dug ourselves a deep first-half hole that we just couldn't quite overcome," Coach Wolters said. "We will played better in the second half, but Atwood made enough free throws to get the win"

The Indians did get much closer in the final quarter but couldn't quite come through.

Sainty was 35.3 percent from the field while the Buffs were 48.3.

Having the best percentage from
