mental Quality Incentives Program (EQIP), reauthorized in the 2002 Farm Bill, was published in the Federal Register for comment on Feb. 10, according to Harold L. Klaege, States Department of Agriculture Natural Resources Conservation farmers and ranchers to use program funding in the coming year. Highlights of the revised Envi-

• reducing in the amount of planning requirements needed to develop a contract;

• providing up to 90 percent cost share for limited resource and beginning producers;

• providing livestock producers




