# Girls basketball season comes to an end with losyses

The seventh grade girls basketball season ended Thursday with the final round of the Northwest Kansas League Tournament. Earlier in the week in the opening tournament games, St. Francis was defeated by Hoxie 34-14, putting them in the consolation bracket for the next round.

Thursday the team traveled to Hoxie and lost to Goodland 24-12 and to Oberlin 24-22 in a heart-breaking loss.

"This was the fourth loss by single digits," Coach David Morrow said. "Three of those losses were by one or two points. With a little work in the summer, we'll win these close contests next year."

## Hoxie 34, St. Francis 14

"Considering the history we'd had with Hoxie, this game was somewhat encouraging," Coach David Morrow said. "The first time we played Hoxie was in January, and we were on the business end of a 58-6 drubbing. Needless to say, we knew we had to play better on Monday in order to have a chance to compete. And after the first quarter, compete we did.

"We were slow coming out of the gate, but picked up the pace late in the second quarter. Some of Hoxie's better shooters went cold and we started playing pretty good defense. During the second half, we were able to find scoring opportunities and capitalize on them.

"Holly Keller ended the game with 8 points (St. Francis' high scorer), getting all of them from the post area. Our guards handled the pressure of Hoxie's defense better in the second half to create these opportunities for Keller.

"The loss of Hoxie put us in the consolation bracket with Oberlin and Goodland. Since Quinter did not field a seventh grade team, we played both consolation teams on Thursday."

## Goodland 24, St. Francis 12

"We knew Thursday could be a good day for us if we played well," Coach Morrow said. "We had chances to beat both Goodland and Oberlin previously in the season, but on each occasion, we were stymied by the press. Thursday, as it turned out, was not much different with respect to Goodland. Their press hurt us and we were not able

to get into our offense all the time.

"One aspect of the game which went well for us was free-throw shooting. Four of our five starters made it to the line throughout the game, together making six points from the effort. Dara Loyd, in fact, was 100 percent from the line, making all four of her shots. Goodland, on the other hand, shot four free throws, missing all of them."

"I spent almost a week remembering this game as a 1 point loss, but in the fog of war, I forgot an Oberlin free throw in the last 2 second," Coach Morrow said. "This was one of our best efforts of the year. This game combined most of the dramatic elements that make up all great games: a starter fouling out, sixth player off the bench plays terrifically in starter's place, unexpected good free-throw shooting, coming from behind, lead changes, last shot chances, etc. It was, by all accounts, a great basketball game.

"Playing directly after the Goodland game, I wasn't sure how our energy would hold up. The girls proved these doubts needless, however, by playing hard from the start. Oberlin pressed us, played pressure defense, and pushed the ball down the court very hard, but our two ball-handling guards, Katie Marin and Dara Loyd handled the pressure very well. During the second quarter, Holly Keller got into foul trouble and Oberlin went on a run to take a halftime led of 5 points.

"The second half was a back-and-forth contest from whistle to whistle. I believe the lead changed three times. During the third quarter, Keller fouled out and Heather Hnizdil had to play the rest of the game for her. She played great defense and gathered in a few key rebounds. Our battle for the game culminated in one valiant, last-ditch effort for victory. With 8 seconds left, we were down by one with the ball out of bounds under our own basket. The out-of-bounds play gave us a good shot that rattled inside the basket and eventually bounced out. Oberlin made a free throw with 2 second left and we lost by 2 points. It was a great game."
