Wrestling wrapup shows many have successful season

Jean Winston The Lakin 3-2-1A Regional Wrestling Tournament and the State Tournament in Hays climaxed the Indians season of duals and tournaments.



Nine wrestlers prevailed at Regionals winning the right to represent St. Francis at state and giving them the opportunity to place in the top six in their weight class.

Three of the State qualifiers earned medals at Hays the weekend of Feb. 28-March 1 with Dylan Loyd placing second at 112 pounds, Derek Ross third at 160 pounds and Trevor Richard fifth at 103 pounds.

Loyd and Richard are freshmen and Ross is a sophomore, giving them each additional years to participate in Indian wrestling.

Also attending State were seniors Travis Hilt and Dallas Walz; junior Trey Hilt, sophomores Gabe Gienger and Gabe Walz and freshman Gabe Smull.

Results from the year show the Indians won non-league duals over Skyline, Colo., and Brush, Colo., in a double dual held at Brush and Greeley Central, Bennett, Adam City, Sterling and Northridge, all at the Sterling (Colo.) dual tournament where they came home with the championship.

In Northwest Kansas League action St. Francis defeated Goodland, Oakley and Atwood while losing to Colby, Hoxie and Oberlin.

Sainty placed fourth at the St. Francis Invitational, third at the Brush Invitational, first at the Wray Invitational, first at Sterling, sixth at the Prairie Classic, first at Cheyenne Wells, third at the league tournament, second at regionals and ninth at state.

This year St. Francis fans had the opportunity to not only attend the St. Francis Invitational, several dual meets in St. Francis but also the Loyd 139 Northwest Kansas League Tournament, where a number of topranked wrestlers participated.




