ORDINANCE NO. 294 AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 2-205 OF ARTICLE 2 OF CHAPTER II OF THE CODE OF THE CITY OF BIRD CITY, KANSAS, AND ESTABLISHING NEW IMPOUNDMENT FEES AND ESTABLISHING NEW NOTICE AND RECORD PROCEDURES FOR ANIMALS OR FOWL FOUND AT LARGE WITHIN THE CITY OF BIRD CITY, KANSAS AND REPEALING SECTIONS 2-206, 2-207 AND 2-208 OF ARTICLE 2 OF CHAPTER II OF THE CODE OF THE CITY OF BIRD CITY, KANSAS

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF BIRD CITY, KANSAS

Section 1: That section 2-205 of Article 2 of Chapter II of the Code of the City of Bird City, Kansas, is amended to read as follows, to-wit:

"2-205. ANIMAL CONTROL OFFICER; IMPOUNDMENT; FEE; NOTICE; RECORD

(a) The city council shall by resolution, appoint a city animal control officer.

(b) The animal control officer or law enforcement officer shall impound any animal or fowl found at large in the City or constitutes a nuisance or otherwise in violation of this chapter in a suitable pound or enclosure provided or contracted for by the City. The impounding officer shall make diligent inquiry as to the owner of the animal and shall notify the owner thereof of such impoundment as soon as reasonably possible.

(c) The City shall collect at a minimum \$5.00 per day as an impoundment fee, or actual expenses associated with the care of the animal taken into custody as an impoundment fee, whichever is the greater of the two. The fee shall be paid prior to the release of any impounded animal and shall be in addition to any fines and costs which result from charges filed against the animal's owner or responsible party.

(d) The animal control officer or police officer shall, upon taking any such animal into custody and impounding the same, make a record thereof, with a description of the animal and the date and place taken into custody. In the event that any animal goes unclaimed for a period of seven (7) days, after having been impounded, the Police Chief or law enforcement is authorized to order the disposal or adoption of said animal as provided in this code. Animals shall be disposed of in a manner acceptable to modern veterinary standards and in conjunction with a licensed veterinarian.

(e) Animals, not considered ill, rabid or vicious, may be adopted after the seven (7) day impoundment period by any person who gives a notice of interest in the animal to law enforcement. Prior to adoption the person seeking ownership of the animal must comply with the provisions of Sections 2-201, 2-202, 2-203 and 2-204 of the Code of Bird City, Kansas, and pay the impoundment fee accumulated by the animal while held by the city. Law enforcement may deny adoption to any person who has previously been convicted of any violation of this section or any law pertaining to the welfare and safety of animals.

(f) The animal control officer or law enforcement shall each month submit a report to the governing body showing the number of animals impounded and disposed of, and the fees collected pursuant to this article and shall pay those fees to the city clerk for credit to the general fund.

Section 2: Sections 2-202, 2-203 and 2-204 of Article 2 of Chapter II of the Code of the City of Bird City, Kansas are hereby repealed.

Section 3: This Ordinance shall take effect upon publication in the official paper of the City of Bird City, Kansas.

GENERAL NOTICE TO CONTROL NOXIOUS WEEDS

The Kansas Noxious Weed Law K.S.A. 2-1314 et seq requires all persons who own or supervise land in Kansas to control and eradicate all weeds declared noxious by legislative action. The weeds declared noxious are: field bindweed, musk thistle, sericea lespedeza, johnson grass, bur ragweed, Canada thistle, leafy spurge, hoary cress, quack grass, Russian knapweed, kudzu and pignut. Bull thistle is County Option Noxious Weed/Weeds declared noxious by the Board of County Commissioners of Cheyenne County. Notice is hereby given pursuant to the Kansas Noxious Weed Law to every person who owns or supervised land in Cheyenne County that noxious weeds growing or found on such land shall be controlled and eradicated. Control is defined as preventing the production of viable seed and the vegetative spread of the plant.

Failure to observe this notice may result in the County:

1. Serving a legal notice requiring control of the noxious weeds within a minimum of five days. Failure to control the noxious weeds within the time period allowed may result in the county treating the noxious weeds at the landowners expense and placing a lien on the property if the bill is not paid within 30 days or,

2. Filing criminal charges for non-compliance. Conviction for non-compliance may result in a fine of \$100 per day of non-compliance with a maximum fine of \$1500.

The public is also hereby notified that it is a violation of the Kansas Noxious Weed Law to barter, sell or give away infested nursery stock or livestock feed unless the feed is fed on the farm where grown or sold to a commercial processor that will destroy the viability of the noxious weed seed. Custom harvesting machines must be labeled with a label provided by the Kansas Dept. of Agriculture and must be free of all weed seed and litter when entering the State and when leaving a field infested with noxious weeds. Additional information may be obtained from the Cheyenne County Noxious Weed Department or by contacting the Kansas Dept. of Agriculture, 109 S.W. 9th, Topeka, KS 66612.

This ordinance creating subsection (e) to Section 5-107 of the Code of the City of St. Francis, Kansas, shall take effect and be enforced from and after its publication in the official city newspaper, the **St. Francis Herald**.
