# St. Francis hosts league art show

St. Francis will host the 2003 Northwest Kansas League Art Show on April 9, 10 and 11 in the St. Francis Community High School gym. The show will feature art work from grades kindergarten through 12th.

"St. Francis has not hosted the league art show for 15 years and I'm hoping that people from the community will stop by and see the work done by these students," said Mary Biekman, art instructor.

The show will set up on Wednesday and will be judged from 4 to 7 p.m. It will be open to the public from 7 to 9 p.m. that evening.

On April 10, the show will be open to the public from 9 a.m. until 9 p.m. The St. Francis PTA will be hosting a tea and cookie reception starting at 5:30 p.m. Talley Morrow and Lila Whitmore, "Silver and Strings," will be performing music during the reception.

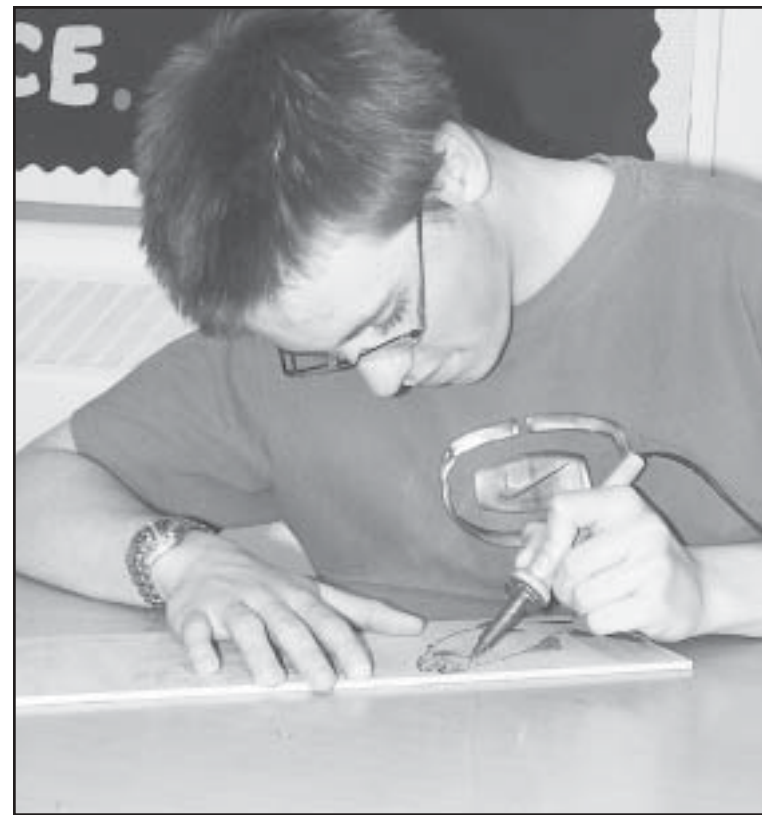
On April 11, the show will be open from 9 a.m. until noon and then the art work will be taken down.

Each booth will be awarded one medal for Best of Show, 15 blue ribbons for outstanding work and certificates for participation for each student.

Mr. Chartier is employed by the Colorado Division of Wildlife and is an art instructor for Eastern Junior College and Fort Morgan in the areas of art history, ceramics, drawing and photography. He will be bringing his own one-man show for display.
