Representatives meet with commissioners

The county representatives for the High Plains Mental Health Board were present to ask the Cheyenne County Commissioners not to cut the budgeted amount for High Plains Mental Health.

Carol Ross and Ilene O'Leary are the county's representatives and they reported that last year, the county gave \$5,800 to the organization. Commissioner Tim Raile said that he didn't anticipate that the county would cut the amount unless the state's funding to the county was severely cut and, if that were the case, there would be other organizations besides the High Plains Mental Health which would see cuts.

Tracy Hillmer, the new High Plains Mental Health director in Goodland, and Tammi Pettijohn, also with High Plains Mental Health, told about the new respite care center in Hays which is now up and running. The center, which has four beds, gives supportive assistance during unmanageable, stressful circumstances to help strengthen coping skills and decrease the risk of psychiatric hospitalization and for medication assessment, initiation or adjustment. Those coming to the center may avoid hospitalization.

Ms. Hillmer reported that there is a new program which includes three manuals. It is not certain where the manuals will go but most likely to the schools instructors to better help them recognize mental problems in children and adolescence.

Sprinkler system

Carl Williams, maintenance supervisor, had asked for and the commissioners had received some bids for replacing a section of sprinkler system plus replacing a section of cement. The supervisor also thought that a buildup of sand should also be removed by first having the sod removed, the sand taken out and the sod replaced. This had not been figured into one of the bids so the matter will be looked at in a future meeting.

The courthouse budget has sufficient funds to cover the expected costs.

In other business

In other business:
• Several vouchers were examined before the commissioners approved them.

• Commissioners asked county attorney Kevin Berens about prisoner keep costs. The attorney said that the prisoners in question were now out of jail. When asked, he also said that the magistrate judge makes the selection of the court appointed attorney and that attorney is based on the fact that the person cannot

pay for the attorney.

• Commissioner Raile reported that he had been asked by a city council member if the St. Francis highway frontage could be cleaned up. Attorney Berens will look into new legislation and bring back information.

• Attorney Berens said the Cheyenne County Development organization is working on the county's Enterprise Zone Plan which is due by April 30, 2004.

• Overtime hours were approved for the sheriff's department.

• Commissioner Jane Brubaker had attended a WaKeeney Juvenile Center meeting and in just a short time, those attending agreed to bring their juveniles to the Center if the cost is kept at \$145 a day.

• Commissioner Brubaker also reported that she would be reporting on the consolidated law en-

forcement plan to both the city councils in Bird City and St. Francis. Commissioner Raile said he would also plan to attend and asked that Attorney Berens attend.

• The commissioners were shown that there were \$2,094 in ambulance write-offs.

• Mary Morrow, register of deeds, and Dave Flemming, road and bridge supervisor, reported that they will be attending workshops and meetings in the near future, which the commissioners approved.

Next meeting

The next meeting of the commissioners will be at 8 a.m. on Friday when they will meet to canvas the votes of the general election.

The next regular meeting will be held at 8 a.m. on April 14 instead of April 15 at the courthouse in St. Francis.

Girl Scouts in first stages of assessments

Girl Scouts of Sunflower Council is in the beginning stages of collecting information for a council-wide performance assessment. A task group of community and Girl Scout volunteers have sent surveys to business and community members, girls, and adult volunteers throughout the 16-county area of northwest Kansas.

The task group chair, May Schumacher, Hays, asks that every-

one who receives a survey to complete and return it promptly. Those who do not receive a survey and would like to complete one, should contact the Girl Scout service center in Hays at (785) 625-5671 and a survey will be mailed.

The council performance assessment is completed every four years and is used to guide the strategic planning of the council.

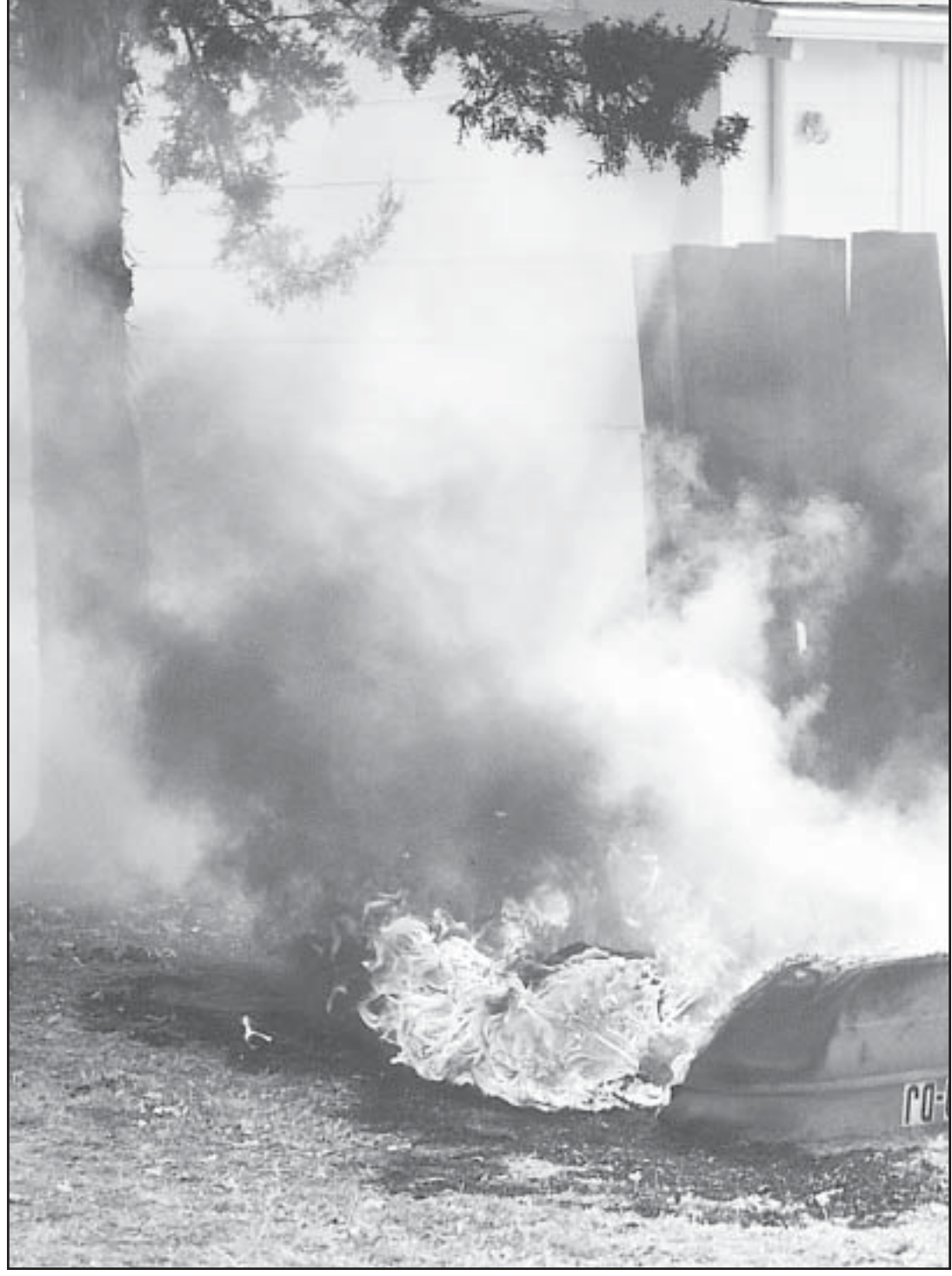
Responders receive operations training

A First Responders Operation training was held March 21, 22 and 23 at the high school in St. Francis. Seventeen of the 19 St. Francis firemen participated in the training of hazardous materials.

Joe Taylor, Insurance Department Fire Chief, Hays Fire Department, showed the firemen what they may encounter with hazardous materials. They also learned about the personal protection equipment they may need to

wear. The county now has some of the protection equipment which was purchased through grant funding and more will be purchased through grants in the future. This equipment can be used in encounters with hazardous materials and also in the case of bioterrorism.

Gary Rogers, emergency manager, reported that the firemen spent 24 hours of intense training and he felt that it was a very worthwhile.

Genealogy Korner

I have not received many family requests for information about early Cheyenne County citizens this winter, if you have any questions about any early county citizen, please contact me, Marilyn Holzwarth, and I will let you know what I have found in any county records I have searched.

One very interesting family I have learned about lately is the family of Orville Grant McVey who homesteaded in Jefferson Township. The family arrived from Ohio when this county was young, with this family, wife, Mary (Cherry) and

possibly five children. *The Bird City News* in January 1887, noted that he was one of the first subscribers of the newspaper. One infant was born here in 1887, and died in 1889, the burial place is unknown. Another daughter, Gladys Julia was born around Bird City in 1889.

One of our early newspapers noted that the father of Mary, Matthias Cherry was a minister. At the time I wrote to the family, this was a new fact. Now they have learned he was a minister in the Methodist Church and they may be able to learn more about him

through this connection. Matthias filed for a homestead here, but evidently did not live here very long, probably only as long as he needed to so he could prove up on the land.

This searcher, Robert Taylor, sent a picture of Grant McVey, you will find this very interesting. Grant is standing in front of a parade display, and is wearing his gun in a holster! The place of the parade is unknown as of now, but it may have been in eastern Kansas, at an Indian Mission.

Robert recently received some facts from a cousin who was lucky enough to find notes from someone who researched the Cherry family around 1880. Wouldn't it be great if we could find a connection between this Matthias Cherry and Isaac Cherry who lost his life in 1886 in a blizzard in Cheyenne County!
