Chosen by her peers, Mrs. Black has been a sixth grade teacher and then went into counseling at Nettleton Intermediate School in Jonesboro. She has been working with children for 23 years and plans to retire at the end of the school year.

This award is given annually to educators from different schools who display exceptional leadership and competence in their profession of teaching and who best demonstrated the Rotary "Four Way Test of the Things We Think, Say or Do"

- First - Is it the truth?
- Second - Is it fair to all concerned?
- Third - Will it build good will and friendships?
- Fourth - Will it be beneficial to all concerned?

Mrs. Black said that, as a teacher, she would think that she was putting everything into a lesson but she was

not reaching some kids.

Now as a counselor, she said she is thinking, "My God, with the baggage some of these kids bring to school, no wonder my prepared lessons in academics didn't seem important."

She has found that the high points in education still goes back to the hugs and the 'Mrs. Black, you really

helped me' from students as well as parents.

As a counselor, she found the hardest moments was dealing with physical or sexual abuse. "It is truly a new world. Every year when I thought I had seen everything, something even more outlandish would occur," she said.

However, there were some fun and funny times like the time when she was teaching a sex education class.

"I would tell my student's parents, I wouldn't teach anything I wouldn't tell my own granddaughters — and I did teach my granddaughter the class — a bit awkward at times!"

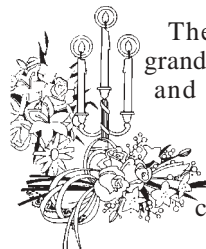
Mrs. Black and her husband Bill were guests at a noon lunch meeting where the award was presented.
