

Thresher show to start July 31

(Note from the editor: This is a press release from Stan R. Dorsch who represents the Tri State Antique Engine and Thresher Association. This organization is preparing for its 50th anniversary show which will be held in Bird City July 31, August 1, 2

Steamed up for 50 years

In the early 1950s a group of farmers and businessmen from the tri-state area of Nebraska, Colorado and Kansas, decided that the heritage of farming in the high plains should be preserved. Tractors had replaced the steam engines and combines had eliminated the need for the threshing machines and separators from the area. This dedicated group of preservationists eventually formed the Tri-State Antique Engine and Thresher Association headquartered in Bird City. After several years of restoration, cleaning and painting this group held the first show at the Roy Kite farm 2.5-miles northeast of Bird City.

Roy Kite was the Case Implement dealer as well as a farmer. Roy had taken a lot of old tractors and vintage equipment through trade ins and other business dealings. Roy had stored these items for several years. With Roy's expertise and ability he was able the spearhead the restoration project.

The premier show in 1953 offered only a tent for protection from the elements. Old outhouses served as bathrooms. Conditions were crude but everyone had a wonderful time. Ladies and children were admitted free and the men were charged 50 cents daily for the first show. Enthusiasm was high and another show was held. There were no facilities for storing the steam engines, tractors and threshing equipment at the Roy Kite



farm so an annual parade of equipment would make the 2.5 mile journey to the Kite farm from Bird City. When they crossed US 36 they stopped traffic from both ways and put rubber tires down on the highway to protect the oiled surface.

The show continued to grow. Articles of Incorporation were adopted, 501 c 3 status was received from the Internal Revenue Service. Officers were elected. Chet Sawyer served as president and Melvin Wright was the secretary/treasurer for many years. The show continued to be held at the Roy Kite farm through 1974. Then the association purchased 20 acres from Ralph and Ruth Leach at the northeast corner of Bird City. With this permanent location buildings were soon erected. The Anderson building, built with funds from Ivan Anderson, Kanorado, the main building with the fold out sides and the country kitchen were among the first built. The buildings are still in use today. Over the years additional buildings were built and now there are 14 permanent buildings.

Additional tracts of land were systematically added: a 6-acre purchase from Bob Sager, a 7-acre donation from Bob and Laurie Jones, a donation from Ralph and Ruby Leach of 12 acres and 7 acres from Jim and Cindy Leach. Today the association has 45.7 acres. They grow their own wheat for binding. This wheat is then shocked and placed inside until show time. During the show they thresh the bundles and sell the wheat at the local elevators.

In addition to the many physical changes at the grounds there is now an annual queen. The queen is selected from the tri-state area. This year as part of the golden celebration they will be recognizing the past queens. The queen's name is known only by the association president, Ken Beougher. He announces the queen nonor the women who were instru-The women spent long hours cookhow the women worked. This year's queen would have been 50-years younger when the first show was held. Time flies.
