"The kids do 50-yards of each stroke, butterfly, backstroke breaststroke and the American crawl, normally called by swimmers the freestyle because in a freestyle race you may do it any way you want or any stroke you want. During the individual medley the swimmers must do all four strokes.

"I'm very proud of the swimmers who put in the effort to learn the individual medley. Any swimmer who wants to do the individual medley for the league meet must first qualify in the race by doing it at another meet.

"Next Saturday we will be swimming in Oakley. Come support the team."
